# RING REGISTRAR

Ring registrar report –

March magazine The ring order form is being sent with this magazine and it is due back to me by 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018. Please check all details on the form before either posting or emailing the form with proof of payment. Your payment may be done by cheque/money order with your form, EFT transfer or deposit at the bank to our BSNSW account. There are no payments made through the BSNSW website. Please ensure you put correct details on the deposit slip or EFT and include your member number (say 1234) e.g.1234rings2019. We are still getting money deposited with no details at all.

Association members are now able to order coded rings, but this must be done through their club Ring Registrar and may have either the club code or their own personal code. If unsure what code you can use please phone me and check it is not already in use. Branch members may order their coded rings either via the Branch or direct to BSNSW Ring Registrar.

Late orders of coded rings will have to pay a \$40 surcharge to the makers and may have to wait for some time until a few orders are together to also avoid the high bank processing fees for overseas of around \$35 extra.

# SHOW MANAGER

SHOW MANAGER'S REPORT – MARCH 2018

It has been a very busy year so far with Show Committee and special meetings in the organizing of the National Show to be held at Penrith from Friday 25<sup>th</sup> to Sunday 27<sup>th</sup> May with organized tours on the Monday and Tuesday and possibly Wednesday.

Many thanks to the people that have been heavily involved in organizing this National in conjunction with the Show Committee. Thanks also to Ann Hand, Jean Painter, Kathy and Ian Manton, Barry Wise, Steve Cummins, Ray Galbraith and everyone that continues to help in this massive task to organize this event. We have had lots of meetings since May last year to date.

Comments at the recent Management meeting held on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2018 include:

1. Vote for E.B.A.G. Associated Society was approved by Branches and Management.
2. Vote on UNBROKEN CAPS – 97% Against 3% For. So in future there will be no Unbroken Caps birds to be shown at Annual Shows or Young Bird Shows.
3. Ring numbers of Major Winners at shows will be checked by the Show Managers on the day.
4. "Rules for Status and Variety Points"
  - a. Branches and Associate Clubs to be allowed to include whatever age groups or classes they wish, any age, young and juvenile.
  - b. Variety points can include – one (1) point Any Age; one (1) point young birds ; one (1) point juvenile young birds ; overall variety points to continue.
  - c. A single bird can only receive one (1) point for status i.e. Champion Or Reserve Champion or Opposite Sex or Best of Variety
  - d. Only overall Variety winners in show receive the one (1) status point

All Clubs must include in their Schedules, instructions on floor coverings for Show Cages i.e. either approved mixed budgie seed or two (2) only French White Millet Sprays.

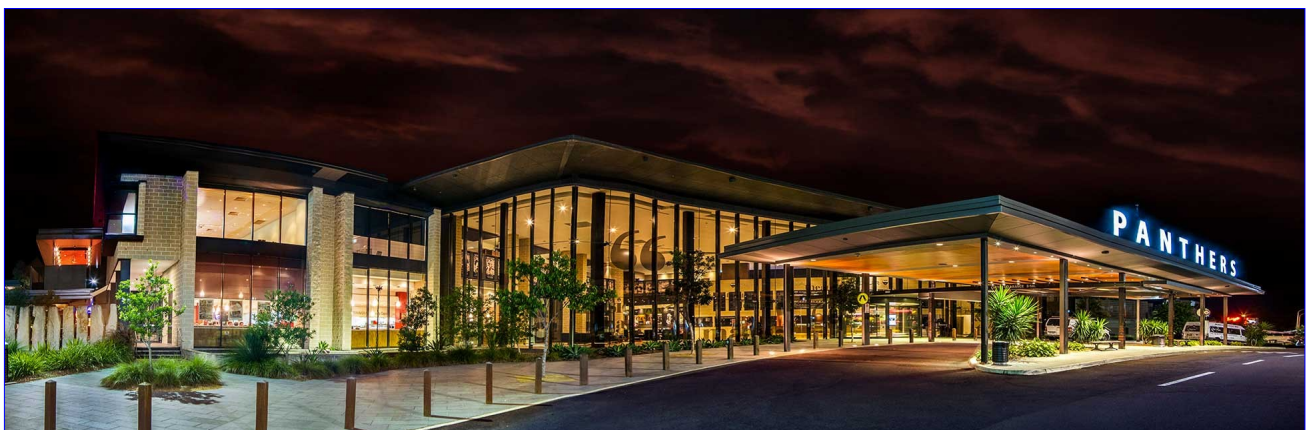
1. Dave Ganzer has completed all the Show Cages and is now fitting out the container so that everything that goes in there has a place to go back in to. Arrival and departure dates for the container are now being organised.
2. Contracts for the fitting out of the Marquee and the hire of the Audio Visual equipment have been signed.
3. Training for our Stewards for the National will take place on the 14<sup>th</sup> April organised by the Show Committee. All Stewards have been invited.
4. If anyone has contacts with a firm that can make a rolling tape of advertisements to be played at the venue during the two days of the Show please get in touch with Ray Galbraith- email [boxer73@bigpond.net.au](mailto:boxer73@bigpond.net.au)
5. We need volunteers! Please help! You do not have to commit yourself to many hours over the two days but assistance is required in:-  
Setting up the Marquee on Wednesday 23<sup>rd</sup> and Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> May, which will involve getting all the equipment out of the container, setting it up in its place in the Marque,( we will have trolley Jacks) erecting the netting over the bird areas,(we will have a scissors lift), positioning the chairs for the audience as per the planned layout, erecting the staging on the stage and in the bird areas ,putting up signs, setting up the tables for the Trade stands, computer Team, and in the bird rooms, selling raffle tickets at the Venue, giving information about our Society to the public at an information stand and lots more.

On the Monday morning, after the show's all over, everything has to go back into the container in the place it came out of. BIG JOB! As well as that, 250 show cages must be cleaned ,dried and packed in their shopping bags, then stacked carefully into the two large containers

allocated for them. We will have disinfectant wipes and hair dryers just to make the job easier and more effective but if you can bring another hairdryer the more the merrier.

6. .At the latest count there are approx 220 registrations in. Stewards and Security personel please note that you need to be registered and Security need to send a photo of themselves to Kathy and Ian Manton. Ss long as it can be cropped to size they will have it on your Lanyard I.D.
7. A late fee of \$15 now applies for registrations.

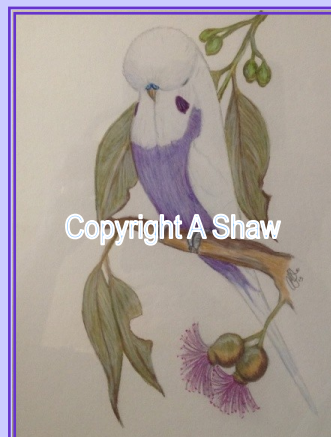

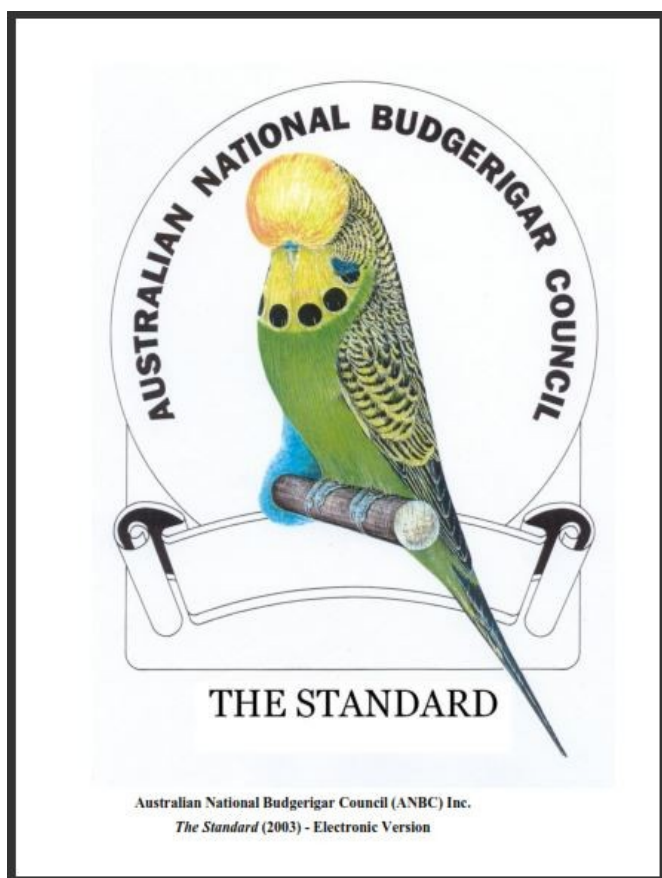

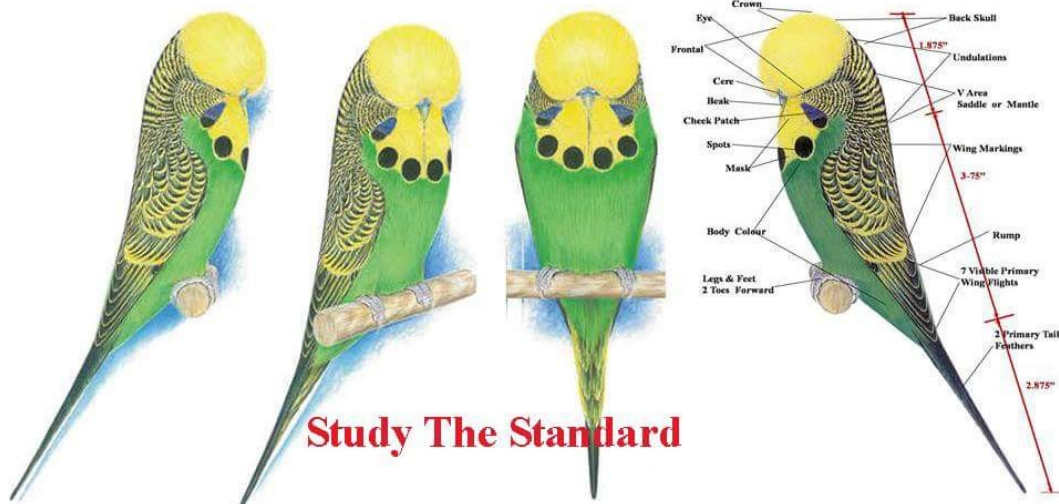

## 2018 SYDNEY ROYAL AVIARY BIRD SHOW



*(Report by Ian Manton – Chief Steward, Budgerigars)*

This section of the Sydney Royal Easter Show was held over the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> March. The venue was Hall 3 at the Showground which was renamed the “Pet Pavilion” for the show.

The area allocated to us was more than last year which enabled everyone to put on a better display and advertise/promote our hobby. It also was more accessible and comfortable for the public to view the birds and ask questions. The representatives from each group (ie African Lovebirds, Budgerigars, Canaries, Finches and Parrots) will continue to have meetings with RAS officials throughout the year and we will be seeking to retain the same area which will enable us to put on an even better display next year. As the “Budgie Rep” I must say that I enjoy working with the other reps that are very enthusiastic and keen to promote the hobby of bird keeping.

It would be fantastic if there could more birds, **particularly Budgerigars**, exhibited in future years.

There were approx. 490 birds across all groups ( African Lovebirds had 97 plus 22 Junior entries, **Budgerigars 76/13**, Canaries 87/12, Finches 86/3 and Parrots 96/1). These numbers were similar to last year.

Our Judges, Andre Ozoux and Jim Baker, while working at a steady pace that allowed the public the opportunity to observe the birds being judged, soon sorted out the winners.

**James Matthews’** Grey Green Spangle Cock was the Grand Champion. **Ian & Kathy Manton’s** Cinnamonwing Yellow Faced Sky Hen was Reserve Grand Champion and a Normal Violet exhibited by **Bryan Martin** was Grand Champion Coloured Bird. Champion Junior Budgerigar was exhibited by **Jade Oldham**. The “Best of Variety” winners were spread over all exhibitors

Over the two days the birds were at the show, the Stewards and Judges took very good care of the birds. There was an Avian vet (well known and respected Mike Cannon) on call. Fortunately he had very little work to do.

As well as caring for the birds the Stewards and Judges interacted with the public answering many questions and actively promoted the Society and the 2018 National. (Judge Andre Ozoux was even interviewed by Channel 9 and that was later was shown on their news bulletin).

There were also many signatures gathered on a petition opposing the State Government’s proposal to classify all bird breeders (and other pet animal breeders) as pet shops.

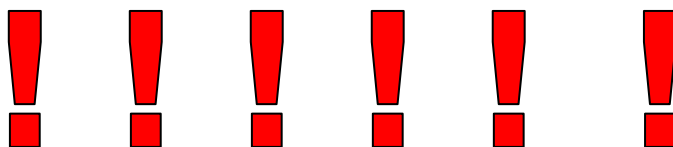

Dear CCBFA NSW affiliate clubs

**RE: HOBBYISTS ARE NOT PET SHOPS – CALL TO ACTION**

Please be clear - this Pet Shop matter could easily see the end of private aviculture in NSW.

**Summary of the issue**

We are fortunate to have detected this matter prior to the changes becoming enforceable under the Protection of Cruelty to Animals Act 1979 and associated regulations (POCTA).

There are two legally enforceable codes of practice of relevance to bird keepers referenced under POCTA, a general code for pet shops and a specific code for birds. The NSW government has been working on changes to the general pet shop code, including removing all exemptions for club (and other) events and redefining the term pet shop to essentially include anyone trading animals of all types. In effect, everyone who breeds animals will become a pet shop.

Compliance with the general code for pet shops is clearly ridiculous for all avicultural hobbyists. The code requires the person in charge to be TAFE certified, it includes a total of 21 written procedures together with an exhaustive list of other registers, directories, training manuals, guarantees, rosters, signage, cage size minimums, etc. All of this is legally required and can be inspected by compliance officers at any time. Hobbyists cannot hope to comply, and in any case the bulk of the pet shop code is irrelevant in terms of improving avian animal welfare outcomes.

If this goes through, private aviculture is dead, and the days of retail bird shops are numbered.

**What has happened to date**

Nobody from the avicultural community was advised the pet shop code would be revised – no consultation, no communication, nothing. We were alerted unofficially that a review of the pet shop code was underway, we obtained the draft documents and began examining the matter in mid-January 2018. We did not believe what we were reading and immediately sought confirmation from senior management at the NSW Department of Primary Industries (DPI). Shockingly, they confirmed our worst fears. The review process has fed down from the various task force and parliamentary inquiries centred on puppy farms – for some inexplicable reason (we have suspicions) all animal breeders have been implicated. According to senior DPI officers, they saw no need to involve other species (apart from dogs and cats) in their “targeted consultation”. We were subsequently invited to make a formal submission and have recently done so – copy enclosed.

The Minister for Primary Industries in NSW is responsible for POCTA and other related legislation overseen by DPI. Currently the Minister is Niall Blair, a Nationals member in the NSW legislative council (upper house). As soon as the severity of the issue was clear we contacted the Minister’s office forthwith. To her credit, the Minister’s Senior Advisor (Ag) rapidly convened a meeting with senior DPI Animal Welfare staff travelling to Sydney from Orange. The meeting, attended by Bob Barnes (NFSA) and Sam Davis (CCBFA Vice President), was productive and there is no doubt the breadth of avicultural interests and the potential dire consequences for all are now well understood. Sam requested a simple assurance to CCBFA from the Minister – that avicultural hobbyists would NOT be classified as pet shops. Unfortunately, this assurance has not been granted – most disappointing – particularly from a National Party Minister – and so the battle begins...



## Call to action

This is likely to be a long drawn out campaign requiring endurance and ongoing publicity, marketing, letters, etc. We need an organised professional campaign and we need everyone who values bird keeping making their voice heard (and keep making it heard).

How do we do this? At the CCBFA meeting on Wed 7/2/18 all delegates voted in favour of the following motions.

- **Motion 1**

All NSW CCBFA affiliate clubs to urgently contact all members to have them meet with, write to, and/or email their local state MP. CCBFA will provide a series of appropriate statements to be modified to suit individuals.

- **Motion 2**

CCBFA committee to appoint a publicity/marketing team to advise, design and implement a public awareness campaign.

- **Motion 3**

Pet stores selling (or with an interest in selling) birds are encouraged to form a network and appoint a representative to our existing CCBFA led expert bird group.

The first requires a concerted effort from all clubs to motivate members to get the message through to their local state MPs. Some appropriate statements accompany this letter - we must make our voices heard so start phoning, writing, emailing MPs now. The second is building a team to manage the campaign - this is happening now with lots of great ideas forming. And third, formation of a representative network of bird selling Pet Shops is underway.

We are currently gathering together people to assist with all the above. Please consider the skills of your members - do we have media professionals, graphic designers, video production experts, etc. in our midst? Do you or your members have direct contact to local state MPs? Discuss the issue with your local pet store - do they understand? Please let us know what your club has to offer.

We are the avian animal welfare experts. We will insist on our standards. Standards that improve avian animal welfare outcomes NOT standards that fill filing cabinets with bureaucratic paperwork.

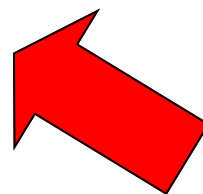
CCBFA is actively in ongoing communication with all relevant stakeholders, including the Pet Industry Association of Australia (PIAA), RSPCA NSW, various other affected animal groups and of course the DPI and Minister's office. However, we cannot hope to do it alone - we need every aviculturist and every bird lover to actively support this effort.

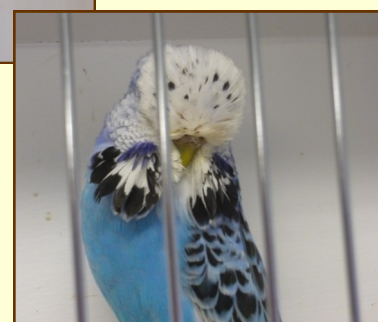

- All rosette sponsors and Trade stands will receive an email this week asking for any payment due, the advertising they wish to have used in the DVD playing throughout the venue, the advertising for the Results booklet and they will be allocated a Trade Table number. Jean has \$200 rosette sponsorship from Peter House which she will bank this week. Jean asked Daniel Child for contact names re making the DVD for us and he said he will send names.
- The details for the centres of the rosettes will be supplied to Colberne industries A.S.A.P.
- Bollards for the container have been ordered from a firm in Revesby and Jim Baker has volunteered to collect them as soon as they are ready. The account will go to the A.N.B.C.
- White Caps for the Auction will be supplied by Jamie Wright, Kevin O'Callaghan, Alan Rowe, Gary Gazzard and Leigh Downey.
- Jean has been in contact with James Bader, A.N.B.C. Judges Panel Co-ordinator re the Judges Workshop and they are working together on that at present. The workshop will be on White Caps. Stewards have received a letter from Ray advising them of a Practice Day at Beverley Park on the 14<sup>th</sup> April and also stating what they need to bring and that they need to register for the National to gain entry.
