Thanks to the committee team for submissions for their reports, timely electronic version helps our management team get less criticism on the deployment of minutes.



Front Cover Story

2016 National Normal Violet

The Anlezark & Bohringer partnership started in 1982 breeding normals, opalines, recessive and dominant pieds. Most of our original birds were sourced from the late Alex Murphy from Warren, NSW. These included a few very good dark factor normals.

In the early 90's we were lucky enough to import birds as part of a syndicate from the Pilkington Stud in England arranged by Ian Hanington and Russell Keane. Since then we have purchased very few birds but do occasionally swap birds with other club members and close friends in the hobby.

Where possible we are happy to assist novice breeders. Selling birds for "big" dollars has never been for us but are more in favour of the social and friendship side of the hobby. We believe that you don't have to spend a fortune to be competitive at the top level.

Start with some good bloodlines from successful breeders and if you are lacking a particular feature in your birds concentrate on sourcing a bird or birds to inject this feature into you current stock. You need a bit of know-how, persistence and luck to be competitive and successful on the show bench and for the breeding season.

Getting to the National Logie winning Violet: We have quite a few birds related to the violet; in fact 90% of the birds in our aviary are related. Most of our lines go back for many years.

We have been fortunate to have won:

- Many placings and awards at STCC, Branch and Society Shows
- Five Logies Two Dominant Pieds, a Recessive Pied, a Greywing and a Normal Violet
- Five second placings
- Twenty or more minor placings at National level with many varieties

Our 1st Logie was in 1996 at the ANBC Nationals in Cairns with a Dominant Pied.

Our 2nd & 3rd Logies were with a Dominant Pied and a Recessive Pied at the 2004 ANBC Nationals

in Coffs Harbour. Our 4th Logie was at the 2007 ANBC Nationals in Adelaide with a Greywing. In 2016, we won our 5th Logie with this Normal Violet at the ANBC National in Hobart.

The father of the Normal Violet is a Cobalt split cinnamon and opaline. He is a large cock with good feather and length. He also has a very nice face and deep mask.

The mother is a normal violet sky blue. As with most of our breeding hens, she is a smaller medium feathered hen with very few faults.

The siblings include two violet opaline hens, two normal cobalt hens, a sky opaline hen, and a normal cobalt cock. All siblings are of good quality.

We have some half brothers and sisters from other matings with the parents. Some of these hens will be paired with this Violet cock this year.

The dark factor feature has been in our birds for many years. We like this feature and believe good dark factor birds always stand out on the show bench.

These days we don't travel around as much only being able to attend three or four Shows per year due to other commitments.

We believe we are one of the oldest partnerships in the Budgerigar Society still continuing after 34 years. The main reason we believe we have kept going is because of the enjoyment not the money.

From the AGM

Andrew Bourne, Vice President BSNSW Inc.

At the BSNSW Inc. 2016 Annual General Meeting a motion was passed to task the Management Committee with researching and developing reforms prompted by the report from the Working Party which has now concluded. (See the BSNSW Minutes of the AGM.)

What I took out of the discussions at the AGM that took place regarding the report from the Working Party was that there is momentum for change within the BSNSW Inc. Almost everyone agreed that we need to do whatever we can to make the Society friendlier and more relevant to all members whether they are members of a Branch or not.

In order to make meaningful change we need to re-assess what we are all about; why we exist as a Registered Society; and what services we should be providing to members.

For those who are not aware, the incorporation/registration process makes the BSNSW Inc. a legal entity that can raise funds and enter legal contracts such as insurance contracts and hall hire. With hall hire alone running into the thousands of dollars it is imperative to be registered to protect members' interests.

We currently have a Vision Statement and Objects registered with Fair Trading NSW. A full copy of the Objects, Rules and By-Laws is available on the BSNSW website. (http://www.budgerigar.com.au/objects-rules-and-by-laws.html)

Our Vision Statement and Objects define who we are and what we do – why we exist.

It is all pretty dry stuff but an essential part of the incorporation process. Given that we believe that we are off the rails to some extent, the place to <u>start</u> fixing it is with these two statements.

We are not looking for legal statements but just plain English statements such as:

- keep membership records (this is a legal requirement anyway);
- collect membership and other fees and manage them legally and effectively (another legal requirement);
- train and certify Judges;
- maintain a Judges' Code of Ethics;
- maintain and certify a Standard for Exhibition Budgerigars;
- purchase and supply ANBC Rings;
- provide Insurance for members and member Clubs;
- participate in the ANBC governance process;
- conduct a selection process for birds to compete at the ANBC National Show each year;
- participate in the ANBC National Show each year;
- run a National Show when authorised by the ANBC.

These are just a few of the many things that define what the BSNSW is here to do.

This is your opportunity for have a say about what you would think the purpose and role of the BSNSW should be. Feedback will be presented to the BSNSW November Management Meeting.

Please do not worry about trying to write new Objects, merely giving us your opinion in the form of dot point will be a great help.

Of course no formal change will take place until it is passed at a General Meeting.

BSNSW Vision and Objects Statements

VISION

Vision Statement of the Budgerigar Society of New South Wales (Inc.)

The bringing together of people in a spirit of cooperation to foster and promote the keeping, breeding, welfare and exhibition of Budgerigars.

OBJECTS

- **1.** To recognise the wild Budgerigar as an integral part of the Australian Heritage.
- 2. To foster interest in the welfare and conservation of the Budgerigar, in the wild or as a pet or as an aviary bred exhibition bird.
- **3.** To encourage, foster and protect the keeping, breeding and welfare of Exhibition Budgerigars.
- **4.** To promote and protect the exhibition of Exhibition Budgerigars.
- **5.** To disseminate information relative to Budgerigars and/or other materials of interest to the members and/or public in general.
- 6. To prepare and/or adopt a Standard of the Ideal Exhibition Budgerigar, and to revise the same as and when deemed appropriate.
- 7. To obtain, issue and promote the use of the Society's closed rings.
- **8.** To promote the efficient and proper conduct of the Branches of the Society.
- **9.** To provide support to Branches of the Society to render an effective access to the Society for its members.
- **10.** To encourage research into the various aspects of the keeping, breeding, welfare and exhibition of the Exhibition Budgerigar.
- **11.** To take such action and do such things as may be considered necessary to the pursuit and furtherance of the Objects of the Society.

Congratulations to Tony Butt, Robert Peffer and Mark Wilton who have been elevated to Cadet Judge Level on the BSNSW Judges Panel. They have passed all the necessary training requirements and are ready for the next step of judging at shows.

We ask all Show Managers to appoint any of these three Cadet Judges as official judges at their forthcoming Shows. When accepting an appointment the Cadet Judge will have a Judges' Committee Member standing in with them. The Cadet Judge will receive the Judges Fee and the Supervisor will not. The Supervisor CANNOT also be appointed as a Judge at that Show.

In addition, Cadets can stand in with any Senior Panel Judge at any Show. In that capacity they can discuss the birds, judging decisions, and the judging process with the officiating Judges. Those officiating Judges will make all judging decisions – not the Cadet. In this case the Cadet does not receive a Judges Fee for participating.

In both these scenarios all the Rules and By-Laws of the BSNSW apply to the Cadets and Supervisors as if they were judging at the Show.

If you would like any more information about the role of the Cadets please contact me.

Trainee Judges Recruitment 2016

The BSNSW needs more Judges and would welcome expressions of interest in our Trainee Judges Program from our members.

You need to be:-

- 1. Willing to commit to the Program (which has been changed to expedite advancement according to ability instead of time).
- 2. Willing to accept instruction from all five members of the Judges Committee.
- *3. Willing to undertake both practical and written tasks.* (*Initially the Standard can be used to find all the answers for the written assignments*).
- 4. Able to attend training sessions at the North Rocks Community Centre on Saturdays and occasionally at the homes of Committee members.
- 5. Of even temperament, friendly and willing to communicate your decisions.
- 6. Involved in Budgerigar activities and Branch/Society positions.

Interview with International Judge

Malcolm Taylor, International Judge from South Africa



Judging the Australian National in Hobart was the highlight of my judging career thus far, many good birds on display through the varieties.

The treatment I received was to say the least tremendous, the atmosphere in the hall outstanding and I only received good wishes and thanks as I talked among the members present. I certainly will recommend to other judges if invited to judge in Australia to jump at the chance.

The judging system used in Australia is unique but enjoyable and been in the company of three Australian judges kept me on the straight and narrow as to how it works.

It's seems no matter where I judge there is always the same questions asked by breeders.

- 1) What do I think of the birds?
- 2) How do they compare with other countries?

First I don't believe that it is fair to compare one country to another unless in Europe where there is freedom of movement. Having said that I can without reservation say that the top end birds would fare very well in any country where I believe the problems lay is the drop off in quality from the top four or five birds and the rest. In Europe that could be as much as the top 10 birds before there is a gradual decline in quality.

As to what I think of the birds, I can only admire the breeders in Australia for persevering and greatly improving the overall standard of the birds with no outside help.

I greatly admire the constant work on keeping the varieties as pure as possible, far too many breeders in Europe and South Africa have mixed up the colours and formed varieties that do not in any way resemble the original.

The only thing that I would eliminate is the flecking on the show bench; it has worked in Europe and South Africa with no lack in quality especially in the Opaline.

Houston Budgerigar Society is pleased to announce that Malcolm Taylor will be a featured judge at the 2016 BAA Grand National in Houston on 22 October 2016.

Now for the interview:

Where do you live?

I live in South Africa on the east coast just below Durban.



What started your interest in budgerigars?

I had birds when I was younger so when the opportunity came to renew the interest I jumped at it.

How long have you been in the hobby? I have now been a member for 42 years.

Tell us a little about the hobby in your country: We like many countries are finding it hard to keep members with costs being a major factor; we have very good birds in South Africa with some top breeders that would be equal to any in the world.

Where did your first budgies come from?

I received a parcel of birds from a friend who was moving; I contacted the local club and met with Ron Wilcox who along with his brother and father was at the time top of the breeders. Ron proceeded to throw out those birds that were no good, and from 24 birds he left me three, I then bought three more from him and the rest is history.

Which breeders have influenced and helped you the most? And why?

There have been a number of breeders over

the years that have had an impact in my life and for different reasons.

lan Bleasdale, my best friend of 30 years and great breeder, George Novel who pushes me at all times,



and Reinhardt Molkitein, taught how to judge.

What bloodlines are in the background of your stud today?

Main line would be Tommy Root/Lutolf with Pierre Swart to lesser degree.

What Club & level do you show at?

My club is the Premier Budgerigar Club and I show at Champion level.

How many birds do you keep going into breeding season?

We keep around 100 birds on average.

How many breeding cages do you use?

We have 30 breeding cages; most are used at the height of breeding. We are fortunate to be able to breed all year round, so none are completely empty.



What varieties do you keep?

Grey including cinnamon, and opaline, Grey Green same as grey, a few others including Spangles.

What has been your best ever bird and for what reason?

Best bird of all was a Grey cock that was never beaten on the show bench. His wins included Best Bird at the National of 2015 along with best young bird, he really was a super bird, and unfortunately he died two months after winning.

What is your best memory in the hobby?

So many memories but I think making new friends has to be top of the list, along with visiting countries.

If you could only show at one show, which would it be?

That would have to be our National.

When did you become a judge? I became a Judge in 1994, being the last intermediate to do so before the rule was changed to having to be a Champion.

I have been very fortunate to judge all over the world. I have judged in Australia, Holland, Switzerland, France, Germany, England, Italy, Pakistan, New Zealand, and America.

Do you have any other hobbies?

As to hobbies I love repairing antique furniture and making toys, I also do egg cutting and decoration, I enjoy colouring, and I play bowls at our local club. Your Occupation? What do you do other than breed budgies? I was a Projects Manager at the end of my working life, starting out as an apprentice carpenter/joiner at 16 retiring at 68. Quality birds from Malcolm's Stud.



What are the things you like most about our hobby?

I think that goes with good memories, the friends I have made around the world and camaraderie that is found in our hobby.

Is there anything in budgies that really irritates you?

My biggest gripe is the costs of birds. It puts people off from even looking at the hobby. It costs thousands in Dollars, Pounds etc, to build the aviaries, then to buy food and then the birds. I think Champion breeders need to be aware of this and not be money motivated. This I believe is also the biggest challenge to attract people to join. I personally believe if we don't look to helping new members then we will end up with an Elitist group and become a rich man's hobby.





A Big Surprise for Owners of Australian Parrots & Budgerigars

There's no such thing as an Australian fruit or vegetable!

Yes, it is true Australian birds in the wild never ate fruits and vegetables because until 1788 there weren't any!

It comes as a surprise to many Australian parrot owners to hear that before white settlement, a mere 200 years ago, there were no fruits and vegetables in Australia. Everything we white Australians eat originally came from other continents. But, Australian parrots had been eating eucalyptus barks, saps and leaves for several millions of years before white man came to Australia and they still do! The trees are still here and the birds are still here!

That's not to say that our birds won't eat fruits & vegetables. They do and some parrots love them. In fact some species are recognized as pests in Australia because they raid vegetable gardens and orchards. But did you know that they also raid commercial eucalyptus plantations too? This is because they need the goodness that's contained within those eucalyptus trees. It's natural to them because they evolved alongside these trees and their digestive systems are designed to cope with eucalyptus leaves, barks and saps.

Here's a list of fruits, vegetables & cereals **that are not Australian** and were never seen on the entire Australian continent until after white settlement in the year 1788. The list is far from complete but we challenge anybody to find a readily available Australian fruit or vegetable.

We don't advise against giving your parrots any of these foods, we just thought you'd find it interesting. So ... what do you think Australian parrots and cockatoos have been supplementing their diets with for all these millions of years?

You guessed it, Eucalyptus.

So what's native to Australia that we eat today? Well' we're sorry to have to admit it but only the Macadamia nut and that was first cultivated by the Americans in Hawaii in the 1920s.

A word about bird cage toys:

No matter what we do for our birds, the inside of the bird cage can never even come close to a pet bird's natural environment.

Smooth blocks and balls in unfamiliar geometric shapes made in carpenter's workshops from woods that don't exist in the wild bird's natural habitat can't be ideal for any bird. To top it off they're then dipped in unnatural (sometimes toxic) chemical dyes. How can they be healthy items in a bird cage?

Do your bird a favour. No matter what kind of pet bird you have - try to get hold of some of the tree branches or leaves it would normally come across in nature. Just watching your bird enjoy itself will reward you.

Remember the toy is for your pet bird. Bird cages and bird toys are not supposed to be there as ornaments for us humans to look at. If your pet bird is a budgie then try toys made from the Eucalyptus trees that the wild birds (budgies) live with in

Budgerigar Diet

Budgies in the wild eat both ripe and unripe seeds. The reason for the consumption of unripe seeds is that they carry more assimilable lysine. You can, in part, duplicate this situation at home with your pet budgie by giving him/her grass seeds from your gardens. Wild budgerigars feed upon grass seeds; mainly on the ripening seeds of the Australian Spinifex and the Mitchell grass which they supplement on a daily basis with Eucalyptus leaves, buds and bark. They sometimes also feed on a few other plants depending on where they are.

The reason for this is that wild budgies are nomadic and don't always come across the same vegetation every day. Territorial birds diets are fixed by what is available in their territory but the budgie has to adapt and this is part of what has made it such a popular pet. Anywhere in the world it's possible to find a diet budgies can exist on.

Being able to exist though, doesn't necessarily mean that the budgie is at its happiest or healthiest. However, as long as you try to stick as closely as possible to what natural budgies consume your pet bird should have a long and happy life.

Pre-packaged bird seed differs from country to country depending on what's available but here are the ingredients you should be looking for on the package: plain canary seed, oats, milled millets including white millet, pannicum millet, Japanese millet and French millet. Budgies can also benefit from seeds of the sunflower, safflower, wheat, buckwheat and maize.

If you want to mix your own feed a basic mix would consist of 40 % canary seed, 20 % pannicum millet, 20 % French millet, and 20 % oats. Pretty simple isn't it? Don't forget that your bird also needs dietary fibre in the form of green stuff and they find lettuce or dandelion leaves appealing.

However, if you give your budgie a Eucalyptus leaf or two per day that's all the green stuff it needs to get all the trace elements, minerals and amino acids it requires. Eucalyptus leaves are also the original budgie medicinal tonic. They act as mite deterrents. They're bactericidal too and act against internal (gut) parasites so they keep your pet healthy. Just be careful from where the branches come from and ensure they are not contaminated by other animals, car exhausts etc...

Calcium Deficiency in Budgerigars

Lack of Calcium in the diet causes more problems in budgerigars than any other nutrient. The reason for this is that many people do not recognize the symptoms of calcium deficiency in their birds.

Calcium is used in the formation of bones and eggs, and is needed for normal nerve and muscle functions.

Since vitamin D is involved in calcium absorption and management it is not surprising that we see so many problems related to this mineral, especially in areas where budgies are kept indoors and do not have access to direct sunlight.

Many breeders think they have no problems if their birds have access to cuttlebone or they get oyster shell, grit and crushed egg shells. They are wrong! These do contain large quantities of calcium carbonate, but this type of calcium is very difficult to absorb.

Wild birds get their calcium from mineral sources like green seeds or other vegetable products that contain calcium in forms that are far easier to absorb. Unfortunately dry seeds are not a very good source of such 'chelates' of calcium.

Modern liquid calcium products, like Calcivet produced by Vetafarm in Australia, mimic this natural approach. The calcium is already dissolved and is linked to a molecule the gut absorbs naturally. This product also includes vitamin D3 which is essential for the maximum calcium to be absorbed.

Because these modern products have such good bio-availability the quantities of calcium the bird actually absorbs is far less than the normal 'recommended daily dose', but they work well. In fact the way to use these products most effectively is to give them less frequently rather than just in smaller quantities. For most birds once a week is fine.

Symptoms

Breeding birds tend to show the most obvious symptoms.

One of the most obvious signs of calcium deficiency is a soft shelled or thin shelled egg, or eggs with a chalky texture. According to avian scientists a hen has about 3-4 eggs worth of calcium stored in her bones. So, if you want bigger clutches, you need a good quality supplement. Highly productive birds may see clutches increase from 4-5 up to 7-9 without stress on the hen! This can lead to a dramatic increase in the number of healthy youngsters you produce in a breeding season.

Hens that are struggling to make egg shells often become egg-bound. This occurs when the bones have failed to provide enough calcium for the egg so the body has 'taken' it from other organs. When the nerves and muscles run low on calcium they stop working properly. Egg bound hens simply cannot push the egg out. They tend to show other symptoms of poor nerve and muscle function too. They can't fly well, their wings droop and their legs are apart.

Traditional remedies include warmth (good), oiling the vent (a waste of time and very stressful) and holding the bird over a steaming kettle (absolute torture). Giving a liquid calcium supplement directly to the beak will often work very quickly. Of course using the supplement routinely could prevent egg binding from occurring in the first place.

A third breeding problem is splayed legs and/or rickets in chicks. With splayed legs the issue is lack of nerve and muscle function preventing the chick from holding the legs together under the body. It is not hens sitting too tightly! Correcting this problem requires constant adjustments to splints and taping. Again prevention is a far better approach!

Another problem experienced by some breeders that is a sign of calcium deficiency is feather plucking. This is not restricted to budgerigars but is also common in finches, canaries and parrots. In early stages of feather plucking the hen will strip the down from the body of the chick as it starts to feather up. The hen chews the down and small feathers so rarely are there any left in the nest.

Sometime the rigors of breeding and demands of feeding chicks take over and she will stop. If not, feathers will be stripped from the back, head and wings. While feathers on the head and body will usually regrow any feathers stripped from the wing butts do not, leaving the bird useless on the show bench. Unfortunately some hens become aggressive and the result is scalped or mutilated chicks.

In non-breeding birds we see both physical and behavioural problems. Because calcium is involved in nerve function a lack of it may lead to nervous symptoms. Fear and aggression are both common.

In pet birds these behavioural issues vary from fear, biting, to self-mutilation. All plucking birds should be given extra calcium.

Other pet (non-breeding) bird symptoms are poor co-ordination, flying and perching. Extreme cases lead to fits that are often incorrectly diagnosed as epilepsy. Budgerigars may have difficulty getting themselves off the ground!

How much and how often?

Traditional calcium sources like cuttlebone, oyster shell and grit should be available throughout the year. These are excellent sources of calcium carbonate, but this type of calcium is very difficult to absorb, so it is important to provide the mineral in other forms.

There are a lot of different factors that affect the amount of supplemental calcium your birds may need. Obviously egg laying hens and growing chicks have higher requirements. Different foods have different levels and absorbability of calcium (all seeds are poor). Tap water around the country can vary dramatically in their mineral content. If you filter your water you are removing virtually all the suspended calcium it contains. People in soft water areas should use far more supplement than those in hard water areas.

It helps to understand how the body manages calcium. The bones have the important role of

controlling the blood calcium level. When blood calcium levels rise the bones suck it out. When it drops they pump it back in. This sounds simple but it is actually quite a complex process involving vitamin D and a hormone called parathyroid hormone. This process works best if it is well exercised. Giving the calcium supplement some days and not others ensures the bones have lots of practice at this job and they respond very well to the surges in demand from egg laying. This is all part of the process of preventing egg-binding.

It is recommended to give the supplement just once a week to non-breeding birds and twice a week in soft water areas. For breeders give 4-5 days a week. People in hard water areas may do fine with just 2-4 days.

There is no doubt in my mind that the introduction of highly bio-available liquid calcium supplements has been the most important bird keeping innovation for decades. It has revolutionized breeding by increasing clutch sizes and maintained hen health so they can safely produce more rounds each year.

After using a calcium supplement for several years, I have not had a single hen that has become egg-bound, or a hen lay a soft-shell egg, or eggs with chalky texture or even displayed the symptoms of having trouble passing her egg. And importantly the average number of eggs laid per round has increased significantly.

Calcium and Vitamin D3 Research in Budgerigars

David Phalen, Associate Professor University of Sydney

A Study of the Dietary Requirements and Toxic Levels of Calcium and Vitamin D3 in Budgerigars

A moderately common problem seen in budgerigars and some other species of birds is calcium deposition in the kidney resulting in kidney failure. The cause of this disease has been hypothesized to be either excess calcium or vitamin D3 in the diet.

To determine the cause of this disease, groups of budgerigars were fed diets containing various concentrations of calcium and vitamin D3 and allowed to breed.

Results of this study showed that budgerigars need less dietary calcium (0.3%) than most other species for growth and egg laying. When dietary calcium concentrations reached 0.7%, mild calcium deposition occurred in

nestlings and adults. When calcium concentrations reached 1.5%, death occurred in chicks and adult birds.

All seed diets containing less than 0.3% calcium resulted in weak bones in laying hens and their eggs did not hatch. Vitamin D3 concentrations ranging from 500 to 3,300 International Units of vitamin D3 per kilogram of diet did not cause calcium deposition in the kidney as long as diet did not contain more than 0.3% calcium.

This research is important because it shows that budgerigars can only tolerate a narrow range of calcium in their diet.

Calcium concentrations in seeds are insufficient, but calcium concentrations found in most pelleted diets will be too high and could be toxic.

Therefore, it is necessary to supplement seed diets with some form of calcium, e.g., cuttlebone and if you are going to feed pellets, they should be no more than 25% of what a budgerigar eats.

This research also shows that budgerigars can tolerate a wide range of vitamin D3 concentrations in the diet without problems.
