General Secretary's Report

Ian Manton, General Secretary & Public Officer

It has been tumultuous times for the Society in the weeks after the AGM with the President, a Vice President, General Secretary, Minute Secretary and Treasurer all resigning from their positions on the Society's Management Committee.

This has resulted in the Public Officer becoming the General Secretary under the Society's Objects, Rules and By-Laws.

A huge amount of time and energy expended by the remaining Office Bearers working to ensure the Society continues and at all times ensuring that our Objects, Rules and By-laws were being observed.

The Management Committee was "requisitioned" by members to hold a Special General Meeting. "The purpose of the meeting is to allow the members to vote on vacant positions on management".

The cost to the Society is approaching \$1,000 to hold this Special General Meeting (includes postage of notice to every member, stationery and printing costs).

The Management Committee was then obligated to convene a Special General Meeting in accordance with the Society's Objects, Rules & By-Laws which means it has to be held prior to Christmas. The Secretary has to, at least 14 days prior to the Meeting, send by pre-paid post to each Member (at the Member's address appearing in the Register of Members) a notice specifying the place, date and time of the meeting and the business to be transacted (ie. agenda).

Please note that no other business other than that specified in the "Requisition" can be transacted at the Special General Meeting.

As time was very limited nominations were called for and had to be received in by 14 November 2016. It was certainly encouraging, for me anyway, to see the number of nominations received.

Blacktown RSL needs to be contacted to book a room for future meetings.

STCC 2017: Seven Hills Sports High hall is being looked at for the 2017 STCC.

Ring Registrar has about 3,000 rings for 2016 left if anyone needs any. Also Steve has been authorised (by ANBC) to mail out the 2017 rings on 15 December 2016.

ANBC have referred some matters that have to be discussed with members.

These have been sent to Branch & Associate contacts for comment.

Action on the "AGM motion" deferred until January 2017 meeting to give the incoming Office Bearers the opportunity to familiarise themselves with recent reports and recommendations.

The meeting was conducted in good spirit with a good "vibe" feel. In the car park afterwards there was an air of optimism.

We look forward to seeing many of you at the SGM at Galston on the 10^{th} December.

Review of the Objects Rules & By-Laws

Andrew Bourne, Vice President BSNSW Inc.

The final report was tabled at the 2016 November BSNSW Management Meeting.

The first step in understanding why the BSNSW has its Objects, Rules & By-Laws (OR&BLs) is to understand why we are an Incorporated not for profit Association.

As an Incorporated Association the BSNSW can raise and manage MONEY in the name of the BSNSW Inc. instead of the name of private individuals who could abscond with the money; we can hold bank accounts, we can take out insurances, we can enter into contracts, and most importantly our members have limited liability when it comes to being successfully sued for an accident or injury to someone at one of our events.

Without incorporation, insurance is almost impossible to obtain; if someone was to fall at one of our shows and be seriously injured, any or all of the members could find themselves out of pocket for very large sums of money – enough to bankrupt individuals. It is almost impossible these days to run events in leased premises without the sort of cover incorporation enables. The two options to protect members are to incorporate or affiliate with someone who is incorporated and obtain cover from them by obeying aspects of their constitution.

The BSNSW Inc. does have an annual turnover of many thousand dollars and peaks in the year in which we run the National Show. We simply could not operate without incorporation. A very big part of the incorporation is that we are not taxed on the MONEY raised by us.

Disclaimer: Do not rely on this as legal advice.

What this means for members?

The BSNSW Inc. is incorporated with NSW Government Office of Fair Trading. You can check it out at http://www.fairtrading.nsw.gov.au/ftw/Cooperatives_and_associations/Charitable_fundraising/Starting_a_charity/Governing_instrument_of_a_charity.page; from this page you can find everything that you need to know.

Along with the privileges listed above comes a bunch of responsibilities.

We must firstly state to the Office of Fair Trading why we exist as an incorporated association. From this comes the ability to raise funds for the stated purpose. This purpose is identified in the OBJECTS of the association. The OBJECTS are registered with Fair Trading and available to all interested organisations or individuals.

Then we must state how we manage the 'business' side of our hobby. We must do this in the form of a constitution. We currently call our constitution our RULES.

We also need to guarantee that the money raised is correctly accounted for and not just used as income for the members. We must keep accurate records of the members plus all our income and expenditure. We are also required to state in our constitution how we manage the association and how the managing committee is set up and how we manage complaints and a few other things.

Lastly we need to supply an audited report of our financial position to Fair Trading each year. That report is required to contain all income and expenditure of the BSNSW Inc. including that of the Branches.

Findings of this review

The BSNSW Inc. OBJECTS, RULES and BY-LAWS are out of date, inadequate, and need replacing or significant updating.

Why did the Management Committee request a review?

The Management Committee of the BSNSW currently has <u>thirty nine</u> positions on it: <u>twenty six</u> of those positions are representatives of Branches. The Branch Representative positions outnumber the Office Bearers by nearly two to one and have the majority say on everything that happens. We still get complaints that members just do not know what is going on. If we had two representatives from each of the thirteen Associate Societies, we would have <u>sixty five</u> positions on the Management Committee.

The most obvious problem is that the business of running the BSNSW (managing the MONEY, the MEMBERSHIP RECORDS and the day to day operations of the incorporated body) and the running of the hobby aspect of the BSNSW are far too entwined in the current Objects, Rules & By-Laws.

There has to be reform here to make this work much better.

It is safe to say that most people simply do not care about the issues that the constitution and the Management Committee should mostly cover - managing the MONEY, recording the MEMBERSHIP and the day to day operations of the incorporated body. They are mostly interested in what it means for them when it comes to the hobby aspects of the society. The current situation, with the hobby aspects embedded in the constitution needs to change.

The BSNSW Inc. has issues relating to MONEY from membership costs, the COSTS of being in formal association with the BSNSW; and the COSTS of running the BSNSW not being shared equally between all the breeders who use the BSNSW services, particularly the team selection and National Show COSTS.

Another issue that plagues some of us is the issue of MONEY raised and held by Branches and who has or should have control over it.

A lot of this has been expressed as a "them & us" situation.

Our OBJECTS start the "them and us" in the BSNSW. Clauses 8,9 & 10 refer to Branches with no mention of other clubs in which we have financial members of the BSNSW. A few simple changes to these clauses to include all members of the BSNSW would easily fix the problem.

The OBJECTS also need to be reviewed or replaced to ensure they accurately reflect our real purpose for existing as an Incorporated Association. Are we here solely for the ANBC standard budgerigars or do we need to expand to cover other budgerigar standards such as "Birds of Colour"? Instead, do we need to specifically exclude other facets of the hobby than the ANBC standard budgerigars?

Our constitution is out of date by many years. It is based on legislation that has been replaced and/or updated several times over. Our constitution (Rules) also contains a number of items that bear no relationship to the running an Incorporated Association. These items should come out of the constitution and moved into the By-Laws where they can be managed more efficiently. We currently need to report to Fair Trading when we change the name or role of the Judges Committee. This is a hobby aspect that should not be in the constitution.

The very big distances between members mean that people in outlying areas do not get to meetings held hundreds of kilometres away from their homes. For meetings at least we can improve this with the Model Constitution that allows both electronic meetings <u>and</u> electronic voting at meetings including secret voting.

The Rules & By-Laws lack the simple steps that are needed to clear up the MONEY concerns of our Branches.

We currently have a problem where things get changed at one Management meeting and changed back at another depending on who attends a particular meeting. We need to have the concept approved at one meeting and the changes not happen until the actual By-Law changes were approved by the members and written into the By-Laws by the Management Committee.

A little bit more about Incorporation and Branch Funds

All our members need the protection of an Incorporated Association at each and every formal function that they run or attend. This is especially important where the event is held in a place where members of the public are able to attend; even more so when members of the public are invited to attend.

There are two ways to do this - incorporate or affiliate with a body that is incorporated. Several of our Associate Societies are incorporated in their own right. Those who are not incorporated can operate under the protection of any other body such as the Canary & Cage Bird Federation or the BSNSW Inc. after reaching a written agreement with that body.

The BSNSW Canberra Branch Inc. is incorporated in the ACT and all its FUNDS are banked under that ACT Incorporation. Other Branches (or clubs) can also incorporate in their own right and manage their own FUNDS if they choose to do so.

An easy option for most Branches is to just operate the FUND RAISING and banking under the cover of the Incorporation of the BSNSW Inc. FUNDS held this way by Branches belong to the BSNSW Inc. because each Branch is part of the BSNSW Inc. This should not make anyone nervous under normal circumstances. The time to get nervous is when the BSNSW is dissolved or is successfully sued for large sums of MONEY. All BSNSW FUNDS may be part of any settlement against the BSNSW Inc. If the branch FUNDS were held under separate incorporation, this would not be the case₁.

What is missing from the current OR&BLs is the detail of how the FUNDS can be raised held and used; and what would happen in the event that the BSNSW Inc. or any individual Branch was wound up.

It is pretty simple to fix. A new By-Law should be written designating each Branch Committee as a Sub-Committee of the BSNSW with delegations to raise, bank and spend FUNDS on behalf of the BSNSW Inc. There should be a small set of conditions around this arrangement which would be spelled out in the delegation to the sub-committee written into the By-Laws.

First and foremost would be a statement that in the event of winding up of a Branch, the remaining members would submit a statement to the Management Committee designating what would happen with the FUNDS. The By-Laws could state that the Management Committee would be obliged to approve that process if it was lawful and in the best interests of the BSNSW Inc. FUNDS could not for instance be just dispersed to the last few members.

This By-Law should be put in place at a General Meeting and thereby only be able to be altered at another General meeting. This would protect the By-Law from tinkering at the Management Committee level.

What could change by updating or replacing the OR&BLs?

We could simplify the Management Committee by making it smaller than the current 39 positions.

We could include more members in the hobby decisions that impact them – especially those who are not members of Branches and currently not able to vote on such decisions.

We could purchase and operate an online meetings package (as Harry's package is no longer available and its use is not provided for in the current By-Laws).

We could be more flexible with meeting times.

We could purchase and implement an online voting package to vastly improve General Meetings.

We could ensure that changes to the By-Laws that impact members were taken to the members by their clubs prior to being implemented.

We could protect club FUNDS and assets.

We could simplify the fee structure to make it fairer for all members.

The way forward

The Management Committee could be streamlined with a better flow of information to and from members.

The most efficient way to restructure the BSNSW is to replace the current Rules with the Model Constitution provided by Fair Trading. This one simple step would completely reform the BSNSW. Fair Trading provides the Model Constitutions for use by Incorporated Associations. It is an all-purpose document that satisfies all the legal requirement of a not for profit registered association.

As an alternative, we could tweak it a little for the size of the BSNSW (400 to 500 members) and perhaps add in a couple of clauses for Life members and Family members. A couple of clauses to protect the MONEY raised by branches could also be added here or in the By-Laws. They could be drafted in a few hours. Also something about our relationship with the ANBC could be included but none of these changes are essential. There are pros and cons to adding changes.

The main advantage of adopting the Model Constitution without any changes is that under the law, all legal changes would automatically apply without us having to spend time, effort and money keeping the constitution up to date.

The advantage of changing it a little to tweak it to our needs is that those changes would be protected from being easily altered by the Management Committee. The same protection can be achieved by creating a section of the By-Laws that can only be changed at a General Meeting.

We should also change our OBJECTS to ensure they correctly define the reason for us raising MONEY.

A new smaller Management Committee would still have overall control of the BSNSW but would delegate most of the hobby work to sub-committees. Those sub-committees would be the Judges, & Standards Committees, the Show Committee and a new Committee or Council with representation from all eligible clubs and Branches.

The Management Committee would still be the formal channel in which we communicated with the ANBC and would also oversee and approve all changes to the By-Laws and implement changes to the constitution once passed at a General Meeting.

Positive outcomes from reforming the OR&BLs

The BSNSW Inc. would meet all its legal responsibilities with respect to the ever changing laws on protection of members' rights.

With some new By-Laws, any changes to By-Laws that affect members would be approved at one meeting and the changes would not happen until the actual By-Law changes were approved by the members through their various clubs. Only after approval by members would the changes be written into the By-Laws by the Management Committee.

This process has the great advantage of giving members more say in changes that impact upon them.

New By-Laws should be written so that the Management Committee would delegate most matters relating to the hobby to the new committee or council of clubs or the other formal Sub-Committees. Any club with a requisite number of financial members of the BSNSW would have a seat on the committee or council. A good starting point would be 10 or 15 financial members and the club or branch is a going concern. It would be the responsibility of the council to keep their members informed as to what was happening or changing in their hobby.

A new By-Law would protect the FUNDS and ASSETS of Branches or clubs. Fees would be altered to make this a fairer organisation.

5. Ring Issue

An ongoing issue with the welfare of the budgerigars breeding period the main concern for all States.

I know for a fact that some have been only 6 or 7 months old and that is not considering the welfare of our birds.

We cannot determine a young bird's age so why do we make it difficult for ourselves and our birds? With Any Age birds States/Zones would have a greater selection of birds to select their team from because:-

- a) Exhibitors would be more willing to allow some birds to compete because they don't have to find only young birds and they'd have more birds to choose from at home.
- b) You would then have an increase in the quality of the birds shown as most of them would probably be more mature and 'at their peak'.
- c) It would not matter if the same bird s won their classes more than once because they would be the birds to beat and if they won the National two or three times they could go into our Hall of Fame as a Super Bird with a photo and write up acknowledging the bird and owner.

We will never again have to worry about a ring issue date and have to consider climate conditions.

The competition would be fiercer.

The participation would be greater.

Classes would be filled more easily at Branch/Club and State level.

Show Manager's Report, 14th November, 2016

A letter received from Newcastle Budgerigar Club suggesting the Variety Awards for both age groups is not needed. These variety awards have been very successful in attracting entries at a number of shows in the past two seasons. Variety points are awarded for any age or young or in young bird shows, adult feather and nest feather; these points were always optional for clubs to include in their schedules. If they wish to have one overall variety winner this is also available but in my opinion to the detriment of attracting entries in shows.

These multi-variety awards have been widely accepted by most clubs as being successful in attracting birds to the show bench.

2017 STCC is to be held on 20th May. So far we have a number of options:

- 1. Homebush cost of \$4,500 per day
- 2. Whitlam Centre. Liverpool cost of \$3,000 per day
- 3. Beaton Park Stadium, Wollongong cost of \$1,100 per day
- Seven Hills Sports High School Stadium cost of \$240 per day.

The Seven Hills venue consists of plenty of parking, staging for 1000 birds is already there for use, which then we will only need to provide the NSW staging to cater for approx. 600 birds. The venue is available for a Friday afternoon setup at no extra costs. I would strongly recommend that we book this venue as soon as possible.

Management approved payment of a deposit, pending inspection of venue by Jim and Jean.

It should be noted that a venue is still needed for the 2018 STCC which will be held on Saturday, 19^{th} May 2018.

The 43rd ANBC National in 2017 will be held in Mackay hosted by the Queensland North and Central Zone from Friday, 26th May to Wednesday, 31st May 2017.

Judges and stewards have been confirmed for the RAS 2017 Show.

BSNSW Annual Show for 2017

This year's BSNSW Annual show although very successful was run manually; it is thought we could improve the next year's show by using a computer system. A suggestion was put forward for awards to be either money or a show cage for each variety winner.

The suggestions of the show dates are either the first or second week in July; this could attract more entries.

My stock came from Gerd Bleicher a personal friend of Hans. Gerd acquired three Anthracite cock birds in 2001. Hans bred two Anthracite cocks and one hen in 1998 from a family of twelve chicks. Parents were a dark green cock and a grey hen. They were thought to be Single factor Anthracites. I received six birds, three of which were destroyed during the PBFD disaster. The cock bird was bred to both hens producing four Anthracites, all cock birds.

The Official MIDD Purbolish ideals

Anthracite - main characteristics

Genetic breeding pattern

Anthracite may be thought of as similar to Violet in that it is basically a colour modifier.

Anthracite is considered a dominant as it does impose itself over other colours. In the double factor the true Anthracite basic "black" appears.

Much like violet in the Single factor form,

Anthracite can alter the shade of colour. Simply stated there are no Sky Anthracites, visually, they all look like Cobalt's much as Sky Violets do not appear as a normal Sky Budgerigar.

Dominance

- Anthracite is dominant over Grey.
- Anthracite is also dominant over Violet.
- Grey can be single or double factor.
- Violet can be single or double factor.
- Spangle can be single or double factor.
- Anthracite can be single or double factor.

Anthracite bred to Non Anthracite = All single factor Anthracite

Improving each Year

- Size has been the most difficult issue to improve in a full Anthracite.
- The single factor Anthracite are normal in size.
- The Pure Anthracite tends to revert back to original budgerigar.
- The solution appears to only use single factor birds at present.
- The hobby has seen similar issues with other varieties. Most of those varieties have seen major improvement in the last decade.

Conclusion

- Consider Anthracite as the newest colour that we have received in the budgerigar world and we can take that colour and put it into all other colours.
- With a little bit of imagination you can picture what a Rainbow will look like ...an Anthracite Rainbow
- You are going to see a wealth of colours and varieties coming, and we can certainly confuse the judges with that stuff.

- Could you to recap on the breeding expectations? Is it a straight dominate?
 - The breeding pattern is exactly the same as Grey.
 - Violet, Grey and Anthracite all breed in the same pattern.
- What was the main feature for identifying Anthracite?
 - The best and simplest way is always the cheek patch.
 - The cheek patch will always be dull and always be dark.



Bird Sale Code of Practice 2015


Canary & Cage Bird Federation of Australia (CCBFA)

- 1 Copy of this Code of Practice shall be prominently displayed at the venue of the event, and a copy shall be provided to all sellers upon request.
- 2 All animals other than birds are banned from bird sales with the exception of Service/Guide Dogs.
- 3 The organisers reserve the right to refuse entry and/or remove any person from the premises for any reason.
- 4 The Organisers will have a Steward or a recognised Avian Veterinarian inspect any or all of the birds offered for sale by a seller and at its sole discretion shall (upon the advice of the Steward/Veterinarian) determine if the birds shall be allowed to be sold.
- 5 The club operating the event and the Steward/s in attendance shall take all reasonable care to protect the well being of the birds at the sale, but shall not be held responsible for escape, injury, death or physical condition of the birds. The seller is deemed responsible for the sale of his/her birds and all of his/her actions. The stewards shall instruct the seller to remove birds showing signs of injury or stress. THE DECISION OF THE SALES MANAGER IS FINAL.
- 6 A start & finish time to be advised.
- 7 All stewards must be clearly identifiable either by clothing or badges.
- 8 All impulse buying of birds shall be discouraged.
- 9 Only birds in good health, full feather and fully sufficient (fully weaned) can be offered for sale. AT ALL TIMES THE WELFARE OF THE BIRDS IS PARAMOUNT.
- Appropriate precautions (e.g. padded roof & solid floors) (wire is not permitted) should be taken for the housing of "flighty" species such as doves, quail and pigeons.
- 11 Wire fronted cardboard boxes, airfreight boxes and carry cages shall not be used. All birds must be displayed in display/show type cages/boxes. All cages/boxes must have a solid base/tray (to prevent droppings and scraps from falling onto table area).

- All cages/boxes MUST have adequate ventilation. Sellers must be able to alter a wire cage by adding solid walls (i.e. cardboard, corflute or a towel) if their birds are not comfortable with their surrounds.
- 12 Only compatible species shall be held in the same cage.
- 13 All cages must be clean and tidy, and in good repair and condition.
- 14 All cages must have at least one perch, and must contain appropriate food and water.
- 15 Cages suitable to the size of the bird must be used. The bird must be able to stand on a perch with the bird's head not touching the roof and the tail not touching the floor.
- Allowing for perch length, the number of birds must not exceed 60% of the perch space used by all of the birds when perched. Therefore the cage should not be visually overcrowded. Overcrowded cages will not be accepted.
- 17 Excessively sized cages should be discouraged.
- 18 All sellers must wear a seller's number and the seller and his/her number must register with the sale organisers. Name, address and phone number must be recorded by the organisers.
- 19 All sellers should supply the buyer with a receipt with the information containing the sellers name, seller's number (the sellers number as supplied by the event organisers), phone number and the type of bird.
- 20 Transfer aviary/room/cage shall be provided and sellers shall be encouraged to use them for all bird transfers.
- 21 A net shall be provided in case of an escape.
- 22 All events must be covered by an appropriate public liability insurance policy.
- 23 Signs must be prominently displayed and loudspeaker announced advising, "All incidents, accidents and injuries must be reported to the sale organisers and/or ambulance officers present" or words similar. A record must be kept of any reports.
- 24 All licensed birds sold or offered for sale should comply with National Parks & Wildlife Services Licensing requirements.
- 25 All care and caution must be taken in the event of extreme weather conditions.
- 26 Payment of seller's fee is agreement to all conditions and rules as set by the Organisers and as set out in the Code of Practice.
- 27 Organisers have the right to refuse any bird or person/s in breach of this Code of Practice, entry to the venue or to take part in the sale.

Research Project into Megabacteria

New research project into **#Megabacteria**. Researchers require faecal samples from birds suspected of having Megabacteria.

We are currently undertaking a large study looking at Macrorhabdus ornithogaster (avian gastric yeast or Megabacteria) and are looking to develop a better treatment for aviary birds.

In order to do so, I need as many samples of the organism as possible from as many different species as possible to determine whether or not there are different strains that affect different species. And whether geographic location plays a role in the species affecting the birds.

I am putting the call out to anyone who thinks they may have, or has had issues in the past with megabacteria in their birds.

Any birds showing signs of weight loss, lethargy, vomiting, all in the face of a good appetite are the birds that we want faecal samples from.

If anyone wants to get in touch with me I am happy for them to email in confidence (hamish.baron@sydney.edu.au). Basically we are after any fresh faeces that may contain macrorhabdus so that I can grow it and sequence the DNA to determine whether different strains affect different species of birds and ultimately find a better treatment to eliminate it from budgie flocks.

I'd appreciate any help you can provide!

Dietary Iodine for Budgerigars

Where do I start?

Iodine is an important part of any bird's diet and a deficiency in this vital nutrient can lead to serious health problems.

Unfortunately budgerigars are much more susceptible to iodine deficiency than most other aviary birds and need higher levels to keep them in peak condition.

Iodine is needed for normal functioning of the thyroid gland. Hormones produced by the thyroid are vital in controlling the metabolism of the body and help regulate many functions in the body including growth, digestion, heart rate, body temperature, the nervous system and the reproductive system.

Symptoms of iodine deficiency

Iodine deficiency leads to a decreased production of thyroid hormone and the body responds by increasing the release of Thyroid Stimulating Hormone (TSH). This in turn causes enlargement of the thyroid gland.

The main sign of iodine deficiency in budgerigars is difficulty in breathing, caused by pressure of the oversized thyroid on the trachea (windpipe). The affected bird typically develops a "clicking" noise or audible whistling or squeak as it breathes. If left untreated it can lead to death by suffocation.

In domestic poultry, iodine deficiency in breeding hens results in reduced egg iodine levels, reduced egg production, decreased hatchability, prolonged hatching time, and thyroid enlargement in the embryos.

Since a deficiency of iodine will decrease breeding performance, some budgerigar breeders use iodine supplements to enhance the metabolism of budgerigars and stimulate the birds to breed, to accelerate the moult of young birds and to ensure birds are at their peak for showing.

Prevalence of iodine deficiency

Iodine deficiency tends to be a regional problem as natural exposure to iodine is greater in coastal areas. Although wild budgerigars predominantly inhabit inland areas of Australia (and eat a diet based on seeds from a wide variety of species of ground plants) they are thought to balance their diet by foraging in dirt and river edges in search of minerals and trace elements.

Pet budgerigars are thought to be at increased risk of iodine deficiency due to their natural reluctance to supplement their diets with additional foodstuffs, particularly when fed on seed-based diets. The iodine content of the various seeds fed to budgerigars varies with the climate and location where they are grown. Australian birdseeds tend to be naturally low in iodine, although marked regional variations occur due to differing soil types and salt deposits.

Until the 1960s, symptoms of iodine deficiency were commonly seen in domesticated budgerigars fed on all-seed diets. The WALTHAM Centre for Pet Nutrition (WCPN) was responsible for establishing the incidence of iodine deficiency in budgerigars, where researchers found that 85 percent of budgerigars suffered from thyroid disease and 24 percent died as a result.

In light of the fact that seed-based diets may be deficient not only in iodine, but in a number of other vital nutrients, responsible birdseed companies supplement their seed mixes to increase the levels of certain minerals and vitamins. For example GOLDEN COB Budgerigar diets are supplemented with a number of essential vitamins and minerals, including iodine.

Treating Iodine deficiency

Treatment for iodine deficiency should only be carried out on the advice of your veterinarian. The usual program consists of a drop of iodine put into the drinking water daily for two weeks, then once a week thereafter. This should continue for at least eight weeks.

Iodine toxicity

Excess iodine can be just as harmful as a deficiency and interferes with normal thyroid gland function - particularly in young birds.

Iodine toxicity is rare in birds and animals since it requires a regular elevated intake of iodine and is most likely to occur in an aviary through misuse of disinfectants containing iodine or over-zealous use of iodine supplements.

The safe upper limit for iodine in poultry food has been set at 10mg/kg by EU legislation. The concentration of iodine in the TRILL budgerigar formulation exceeds the minimum requirements established by the WCPN and is below the EU safe upper limit for poultry.

Iodine toxicity has not been well defined in caged birds, but has been observed in poultry fed a ration with an iodine content of 625mg/kg. Broiler chickens showed signs of iodine toxicity, including poor growth and reduced food intake, when fed a diet containing 900 or 1,200mg/kg iodine for nine to 13 days. Excess iodine in grower diets can prevent sexual maturation in male and female fowl.

In breeding poultry, fertility of female breeders is unaffected by high iodine intake, but hatching of fertile eggs is reduced, hatching time is extended and embryonic mortality and dead-in-shell proportions are increased. In contrast, male fertility is decreased because of an increased incidence of dead spermatozoa, although hatchability of eggs from normally fed hens is unaffected. All reproductive variables, together with feed intake and body weight, have been shown to return to normal within seven days of feeding a diet with normal iodine levels.

Avian Iodine Deficiency

If pet birds are not given a proper diet, they can suffer from nutritional disorders. One such nutritional disorder is iodine deficiency, which is common in budgerigars.

Iodine deficiency affects a bird's thyroid gland -enlarging it from its usual size of three millimetres,
to about one centimetre, or more. (The swelling of
thyroid gland, due to iodine deficiency, is called
Goitre.) For birds, the thyroid gland is located in the
neck and is one of the glands that maintain proper
function for various bodily organs.

Symptoms and Types

Birds deficient in iodine will have a lump on its neck; this is due to the enlarged thyroid gland. The animal will also have difficulty breathing, usually recognized as loud and harsh breaths, wheezing, and clicking. Some birds will have difficulty eating or regurgitate food, while others will less tolerant to stress and express behavioural problem.

Treatment

As always, follow your veterinarian's advice to reverse the iodine deficiency. Lugol's iodine -- one drop for 250 ml (1 cup) of water -- is used often to combat this condition.

Prevention

Including iodine in your bird's diet will help prevent iodine deficiency, as well as goitre.



Charcoal

Charcoal could be used as avian digestive aid; it may deactivate toxins produced by pathogenic bacteria in the gut. Charcoal may be offered as a first aid treatment where the bird has eaten or you think the bird has eaten toxic plants or other substances prior to getting advice from an avian veterinarian.

Charcoal is not a food source; it has no nutritional value so only use it sparingly. Large amounts of Charcoal can cause black droppings which may be taken as a sign of disease.
