

A TRIBUTE TO MARK FINNIMORE PRESENTED AT MARK'S FUNERAL ON 17TH MAY 2021

Previous contributions to today's service have focused on the many years of Mark's life. My contribution will focus on the last 2 years.

I wish to thank Mark's family for the opportunity to say a few words about Mark.

I have known Mark for 2 ¼ years from the time when he became the Secretary of the Budgerigar Society of NSW in February 2019. At the time I held the position of Treasurer of the Society.

During that short time, Mark and I formed a very close working relationship as we both had the same goals to bring about a monumental shift in the management of the Society. We would be in contact most days discussing issues relating to the Society's activities.

Mark had a tremendous work ethic and had a strong desire to bring about change in the Society, so that all Clubs had a say in the Society's management structure. The structure had not been changed for at least 27 years. There had been a few efforts attempted to modernize the Society's structure in recent years without success. Mark had the fortitude to succeed where others had failed.

Mark spent many hours, days, and weeks consulting and listening with the Society's membership and managing the affairs of the Society. He was focused and passionate about his role as Secretary, these traits no doubt developed in managing his business interests prior to his retirement.

From my experience over the past 2 years, no one has achieved anything like what Mark did for the Society and over such a short period of time.

What Mark achieved will forever have an impact on the Society.

In the last few months of his life Mark refused to let his deteriorating health impact on carrying out his role as the Society's Secretary. His family provided what assistance he needed, Mark's wife Sue with the considerable correspondence Mark received and Kelly his daughter with any documents that needed processing. Mark would say, Kelly will do that in no time. Mark's son Martin; each time your name came up in our discussions it was in relation to your latest achievement on the golf course. For a golfer like myself who in all honesty can drive the ball 160-170 metres, Mark and I were in awe of your ability to hit an insane 300+ metres and that you only needed half the number of allowed clubs. Mark took great pride in your golfing achievements and your success in managing the family's business companies along with Sue and Kelly.

It is ironic that the changes to the Society's constitution that members had approved in February of this year were approved by the NSW Department of Fair Trading on the day that Mark passed away. On this day the revised constitution came into effect.

Mark was building a strong stud of budgerigars, the fruits of his achievements he was prepared to share with other breeders. I was the beneficiary a few birds and I am sure others would have had similar experiences.

Mark was a supporter of the Macarthur Budgerigar Club of NSW of which I am the President. At our Annual Show 2 weeks ago Mark made the effort to attend the show along with his family even though he was very ill. His effort to get to the show venue at Picton was an indication of the person that Mark was; a strong supporter of Clubs and their members.

The Society will be so much the poorer without Mark's presence.

Rest in peace Mark you have led a very full life.

Australian Whitecap Subcommittee

Members:

Australian Whitecap Inheritance:

The Australian Whitecap demonstrates dominant breeding characteristics as proven over years of breeding trials and documented results.

Recommendation:

Given this inheritance characteristic, this variety has and will progress rapidly to Exhibition level and should be more than competitive after the demonstration period.

Scale of Points:

The Australian Whitecap is differentiated from other varieties by the white cap (or crown), plus a yellow pigmentation that travels from the cere throughout the body to the secondary tail feathers. Therefore it will offer an opportunity to assess the markings for the variety it is displayed in conjunction with (i.e. Normal, Dominant Pied, Spangle, Opaline, etc.), and it's own unique varietal features. Therefore it demonstrates the need to be judged on both.

Recommendation:

The Australian Whitecap should be judged according to a scale of points with an "emphasis on markings and/or varietal features". This allows judges the opportunity to assess both the quality of the markings and the varietal features of the bird. We recommend this be added to The Standard.

The Standard for Australian Whitecaps:

A Standard for Australian Whitecap Single Factor and Double Factor has been approved into The Standard. This was reviewed to determine if the breeders of this variety now see room for extension of the original description of the variety.

Recommendation:

It was clear from discussions amongst the subcommittee that an 'emphasis on the purity of cap (or crown) would be seen as logical for this variety. The variety is initially distinguished by its white cap, and this should therefore become a hallmark of the variety, so placing emphasis on purity of the white cap was agreed to be a positive addition to the existing Standard for the variety.

Purity of white cap was seen to be supporting the ongoing development of the variety, and provided a more evenhanded way of assessing the cap quality of both single and double factor specimens.

Matrix Positioning:

While the variety is still in the improvement stage, it is sensible to allow it to be combined with any variety. This provides the best opportunities for breeders to utilize their best breeding stock to continually improve the variety to the highest exhibition standard.

Recommendation:

Presently we see all birds displaying the Australian Whitecap varietal feature should be entered into the exhibition class. We recommend this be added to The Standard. The inclusion of all varieties with the Australian Whitecap should be reviewed annually, and in particular through the three year demonstration period at the Australian National Championship Show.

Exhibition of Single and Double Factor Australian Whitecaps:

Presently there is a Standard for both Single and Double Factor Australian Whitecap, although the number of Double Factor AWCs on display at shows has been more limited. Therefore, both are able to be judged to their own varietal features, which differ from each other in several ways.

Recommendation:

The inclusion of both single and double factors will promote the overall variety, although there were questions about whether exhibitors would prefer to see only single factors at the Australian National Championship Show. Given there is no precedent with this particular variety, both single and double factors should be permitted on the National show bench, with annual review, particularly through the three year demonstration class period. This will provide an opportunity to gauge how many double factor AWCs are able to make the respective State Teams, and provide an opportunity for exhibitor feedback on the popularity of the double factors at the ANBC Show.

Annual Review by the Subcommittee:

The three year demonstration period at the Australian National Championship Show represents an opportunity to review the quality of the variety by the subcommittee, judges and all hobbyists attending the show.

However, structured review and feedback to the ANBC was viewed to be crucial in seeing the variety continually improve, and communication occur on their progress. This should help the variety move through the demonstration period, and hopefully become a mainstream class at the ANBC Show.

Recommendation:

Staging of the Australian Whitecap should occur at the end of either the Saturday or Sunday judging session at the ANBC Show. The birds should be held on the staging, firstly for inspection and discussion by the subcommittee. A report summarizing the main points of feedback would be presented to the ANBC afterward. This could take approx. 15 minutes.

There may be an opportunity to also run a brief judges workshop, allowing any State or National Judge the opportunity to learn more about the varietal features and the progression of the variety. This would **NOT** be used to critique the judging on the day, but rather take a positive and proactive approach to measuring the progress of the variety, and highlighting varietal features for judging purposes. If a forum were to run off the back of this it could be facilitated by one of the subcommittee members for a period of not longer than 15 minutes.

Limiting the time of any assessment period should prevent unnecessary stress on the birds, and allow the full class to be moved to the regular staging for the viewing public.

Subcommittee Members:

Regardless of how the subcommittee is structured or changed in the future, it will be required for the three year demonstration class period at the ANBC Show to provide regular reports to the ANBC following the Australian Championship Show.

Recommendation:

Subcommittee members should actively breed the variety to ensure some base knowledge is present. The subcommittee should be retained for at least the period over which the variety is a demonstration class at the ANBC Show. This will provide an opportunity for regular and structured feedback to the ANBC about the variety, at least annually. The focus on this feedback should be:

The progress of the variety for exhibition purposes,

Ongoing assessment of the Standard for the variety,

Feedback on the varieties that are combined with it on the show bench, and

Feedback on the single and double factor forms in relation to the popularity of each and the show qualities displayed by each factor over the demonstration period.

USING GARLIC TO PROTECT AGAINST MITES & INTESTINAL PARASITES

Over the centuries Garlic has been used for its health and medicinal benefits in addition to natural antiparasitic qualities. Garlic is able to slow and kill over 60 types of bacteria, as well as some potent viruses.

To get maximum benefits from garlic make sure it is crushed or juiced.

As with all natural supplements, garlic should be used in moderation.

500ml (US 1.05pts)


I add a little crushed garlic to the soft food that I feed with sprouted oats once every 7-10 days.



To protect against mites and intestinal parasites like roundworms, add approximately 5% of pure garlic juice to clean filtered water, and use as the only source of drinking water for 7 days.

It is important to use this mix for several days straight.

Except when feeding chicks, some budgies do not consume a large volume of water. Continuing the treatment for several days ensures all birds get a good dose.



Now mix your garlic water with twice the amount of fresh filtered water and it is ready for the birds.

Use as the only source of drinking water for 7 days.

** As with most natural additives you do not have to measure exactly. Use what you have available and what works best for your birds. **

Another good idea to protect your birds from mites - Put a teaspoon of garlic powder in the nest box concave with wood shavings when you pair up. The hen will scatter it into all cracks to take care of any mites while breeding.







WHAT MAKES A GOOD EXHIBITION BUDGERIGAR?

You're a beginner, inspecting an aviary full of exhibition stock. You might feel you know what you like, but how do you really tell a good 'un from a bad 'un? Jon Ashby has the answers

Exactly what am I trying to breed into my birds to forge a really top exhibition budgerigar?

This is the ever-present question among all fanciers.

"Focus on the budgerigar society ideal," many will reply, and to a large degree, this is the answer. But the modern budgie is evolving, being tweaked or perfected or developed - you choose the term - by those striving to create the show budgerigar of the future.

Trying to maintain the level of your stud, while breeding out all the undesirable ones, is no easy task.


The best breeding are those who maintain a high level, and numbers, of show birds on the bench year in and year out, not ones that come and go quickly with great fanfare. Think of the Lukes and Norrises, for example...

The frame size of your bird is key. This is not all about feather, but how big a body there is underneath all the down and feather. Try and feel through the feather of the birds you are buying in. Maintain a line of largeframed birds in the shed to keep this key factor present, and prevent it from slipping away.

It is a simple view, but the biggest birds will usually trump the others in a class, all other things being equal.

I do not intend to write here about not having faults on an ideal show budgerigar because all that pretty much goes without saying. But winning birds are in top condition, washed and prepared, feathercomplete without flecking, and do not demonstrate extreme feather, especially in the flights and tail, and so on.

Quality show birds are stylish. I can use the normal, hackneyed terms such as "swank" and "deportment" when describing top show birds, but in layman's terms

a budgerigar should look like a superstrong bird, full of vigor - like a top racehorse, all power, strength, and balance.

Balance is key. I describe breeding exhibition budgerigars as trying to create an Olympic decathlete rather than a bodybuilder.

The ideal birds should have a lovely straight backline when viewed from the side perspective, without a hinged tail. The bird must not be slumped on the perch or sitting across it.

Accompanying that straight backline the bird must sit on the perch at an angle of 30 degrees from the vertical. The BS ideal described an exhibition bird as looking "natural and fearless", which I really like as a description. Flighty, skittish birds should be left at home.

Modern budgerigars need to be wide in the face and deep in the neck, which will give the bird a look of being largershouldered.

My good friend Kevin Pestell loves to describe a top modern budgerigar as "a large carrot-shaped being". To be fair that's a lovely simple description for those new to the hobby.

The top end (that is, the head) is key. You require a bird with a wide face, not pinched or keyhole-shaped when viewed square on. The beak should not be prominent or protruding, but rather flush with the mask, ideally - like an owl, if you will. The mask should be super-deep, as far down that chest as possible. You will be amazed how much of a difference a long mask makes to a bird.

The feathers - now this is really key - should be arranged like a fan around the cere. This is the famous directional feathering and to make these particular feathers longer, more pronounced, and wider is something we all want to be able to do.

Finally, that mask should have six lovely big round spots, augmenting the whole look.

Penalty and Disqualification Clause for Head Marking

As of January 1st 2020 the Penalty and Disqualification clause for Head Marking in the ANBC standard will be introduced and applied at all future shows.

This article will try and explain how the judges apply this clause and how they interpret the varying degrees of head marking. It is important for Exhibitors to understand what birds will be penalised and what birds will be disqualified.

It is very important that we use the correct terminology in explaining Head Marking. Calling it Head Flecking only infers one type of Head Marking and will be very confusing going forward.

Firstly let's explain the different types of Head Markings.

Flecking. Flecking is the cap feather with a spot in the feather, can be round or elongated but distinctively spotting in the feather and probably the most common form of head marking.

Ticking. This is identified by a vertical strip down the centre of feather and is the second most common form of head marking.

Grizzling. This is the least common form of Head Marking as it usually occurs on certain varieties. The easiest way to explain is that it is a marked feather with no mixed pattern but is usually streaky following the direction of the feather barbs.

If you now have an understanding of the different types of head marking, it is important to understand that there can be different shades of marking; very deep in colour and very distinguishable and they can also be very light. Not to be confused with
