Paul has been in the breeding of budgies for the last 20 years. He has had a lot of success with his birds and become intermediate in 2013.

When Paul wanted to show me (Bittina) how to hold a budgie, when I went to hold one he scared me with them and I told him to bugger off the men can do it now.

Paul loved to help others; he was always the first person that held up his hand if someone needed help. Paul was always straight up and told you what he thought all the time and you always knew were you stood you with him. He also always showed how much he cared.

Paul was diagnosed with Metastatic disease with unknown primary in January 2015. He Started treatment straight away and was doing fine until 31st August 2015. We found out this cancer had spread and he was told he had less than 3 months to live. On father's day night, I had to

take him to hospital and he was admitted to palliative care unit for pain management. One day after my birthday, he passed away with me by his side on 15th September 2015 at 11.43pm. Even though his passing has been hard for me, I am still going to honour his memory and still keep up his legacy by keep breeding his birds for him.

We are now called "Ely Family" with the help of Budgerigar Improvement Society chairman, Wayne Doull and now show manager, Mark Perez. They both have supported me, teaching me the aspects of breeding and how to hold and ring birds. I would like to thank both Wayne and Mark for their support in this hard time. I know Paul is watching over me as I now have 14 new Black Eyed budgies and I have been breeding since 19th September 2015.

Paul, you will be sadly missed but you will never be forgotten XOXO

In May 2003 the ANBC Inc. decided to establish a 'Hall of Fame' with an inaugural division of 'Breeder Excellence'. ANBC National Class wins from and including 1983 were included in the tally. The criterion used for induction into the Hall of Fame, Breeder Excellence Division is:

- An exhibitor (or partnership) winning classes on seven (7) occasions; or
- An exhibitor (or partnership) winning the same class on four occasions.

At that time **Alan and Chris Druery Partnership** from New South Wales already had nine (9) wins. With Subsequent wins in 2006, 2009, 2011, 2012 (2) and 2015 to make a total of 15 wins altogether.

He was bred from a cousin to cousin pairing; the InterBranch Selection (now called the State Team Challenge Competition (STCC)) was the first time this bird had been shown at the age of 9 months.

He had two Uncles that were Brothers in the BSNSW Team at the Nationals in Canberra in 2011, one Normal Sky Blue and one Normal Yellow Face.

The Normal Yellow Face won the class and has also won Grand Champion and many variety awards since.

We are hoping for some more success in the future with this line of birds.

Avoiding Heat Stress this Summer

I thought that a few tips around what people can do to make it more comfortable for budgies in such heat might be useful.

Birds displaying signs of heat stress will show the following clinical signs:

- their wings will be held away from their body and slightly raised;
- they may be open mouth breathing or panting;
- they will be reluctant to eat or move around;
- they may be on the floor of the aviary to try and stay in the coolest areas; and
- they may be lethargic and depressed and can pass away if the heat stress remains.

It is important to remember that the native budgie adapted to survive in the outback of Australia. Our exhibition birds, though, are a far cry from the little green flying machines that still live in the desert fringes, and so it is important to support them through times of hot weather to prevent the advent of heat stress.

Our newer members and Novices might appreciate some of these simple, yet effective, suggestions to reduce stress.

- In summer, have a water sprinkler attached to the roof of the outdoor section of your aviary, so it can be turned on when necessary by anyone who is home at the time, or use a timer so that comes on at set intervals when you are not at home.
- Have shallow dishes of water over the floor of the flights so the birds can bathe. In hot weather the birds will most likely be sitting on the ground.
- 3. Spray the birds with a hose or spray bottle at regular intervals throughout the day.

4. Put shade cloth over the flights and wet it.

Dr Hamish Baron, Senior Veterinarian

If there is any breeze will blow colder air through the wet shade cloth.

- 5. Do **not** have birds in the breeding room in January and February if you live in an area that gets particularly hot. If you have any birds breeding, then in very hot weather the hens will be reluctant to abandon their eggs/chicks. The heat in the nest box will be intense and the hens will be the first to die.
- Set up fans in the breeding room. Open all doors and windows so long as they are meshed and the birds cannot escape.
- Nest boxes can be covered with damp cloths and refreshed regularly with cold water.
- 8. Ice added to the drinking water will at least give them a cool drink.
- 9. Wet spinach or greenery provided to the pairs or birds in the flights never fails to tempt them to bathe in it.
- 10. If you have internal nest boxes, and can remove the lids, do so.
- 11. If you have external nest boxes, think of some way you can open them without the hen getting out e.g. remove or prop up the lid and cover the top with pieces of mesh wire (cut to size well in advance).

Many of our more experienced members will have devised different ways to help their birds overcome the heat so it would be good to hear your experiences in future issues of our Bulletin.

Hopefully these tips will help in the welfare of our precious birds.

Questions for Discussion

Question from Denis Beckett:

Does the size of the egg make any difference to the youngster that is likely to come from this egg?

The egg is fertile. The photo shows a clutch of eggs with one egg much larger than the rest.

Thank you for your interesting question. I have looked at some research online but cannot find any studies of budgerigars.



However there are some interesting observations of other species.

It appears that egg size does not seem to affect hatchability and does impact upon hatch weight – the bigger the egg, the bigger the hatchling.

However the story varies dramatically from there. In some species, a bigger chick is shunned (my words) by the parents as too much work and ends up going backwards or even dying due to lack of attention.

In others, the bigger the hatchling, the bigger the adult. Baby birds that feed themselves (e.g. chicken or guinea fowl) seem to fit this category almost universally but also some other birds where the first egg is the largest.

Please let us know how you get on with this egg and I invite anyone out there who has had experience with larger eggs that have hatched to let us know their outcome.

News from the Show Manager

Jim Baker

I am getting lots of queries from members about their status points. Due to reasons beyond anyone's control, we cannot guarantee our records just at the moment. We are fixing the problem as quickly as we can. The BSNSW is currently testing an online membership database.

The Society's policy is that anyone can move from Novice to Intermediate or even to Open at any time they wish. However, once you show at a higher level even for one show, no one can move down in status without very good reason. As result of this, if you think you are entitled to more points than the records indicate, and you request to be recognised for those points, you will be allocated those points. This means that you will be a little closer to earning your promotion to the next level or maybe you will have reached the next level.

At the moment a Novice needs 6 points (or more if you happen to earn points with different birds at one show) to move to Intermediate. We will send you a notification letter and you will no longer be able to show in Novice. You will be returned to zero points in Intermediate. A further 15 points later you will move up to Open. If you need more help to understand the allocation of points, then please talk to someone in your Club or Branch to explain to you how the points are allocated.

Foster and Corbett are now on 12 points in Intermediate as of 15/12/15. Darryl Sheather has been confirmed as Novice on three (3) points. John Swift is now in a partnership with Graham Wise exhibiting as Swift and Wise in Intermediate on seven (7) points

Matt Monsma has been confirmed as Novice on two (2) points.

Perfect Paring

Fred Wright, UK Breeder, Judge and Author

We make what we think will be a perfect pairing and are disappointed with the results - some of the youngsters are pleasing, but too many lack the quality we want. We wonder how such a pair can produce youngsters that are at both ends of the scale.

Let's make some points first:

- I would need to be convinced that it's visually a good pairing
- I would want to ask if the partners are related in any way or are they completely unrelated
- I am very much of the opinion that pairing unrelated birds produced some great youngsters BUT you only get the benefit of the outcross if both partners are pedigree bred
- Sometimes we bring in an outcross and pair it into our own birds but the results are a complete disappointment.

I like to pair related birds, the best pairings are probably cousin to cousin, but by pairing related birds we tend to get consistent quality in all the youngsters. However, if we keep pairing related birds together and we bring in no fresh blood, the youngsters seem to reduce in size slightly, but all the youngsters start to look very much alike. My method to breed quality budgies is to pair related birds but it's vital to introduce unrelated birds on a regular basis.

If we make that pairing that we believe to be an ideal pair, we need to look into the background of both birds. In years gone by, I found that if both birds are bred from quality birds they are more likely to produce quality youngsters. If even one of the partners is bred from nothing special and the youngster is better than the parents, I find it rarely produces anything of real quality. I have no doubt that only birds bred from quality pairs, seem to be able to produce more quality youngsters. Sometimes we bring in an outcross and pair it into our own stock and we are



desperately disappointed with the youngsters. We don't know the reasons but some outcrosses don't seem to work with our own birds. The expression is that they just don't "work" with our own stock. I would give them as second chance with another partner, but if the results are disappointing again - I would give up, not use the outcross again or any of the youngsters from the bird.

I have had the joy of interviewing many top breeders around the world and they all tell me the theories of pairing related birds and it's how they breed their winners. On many occasions I have interviewed the winner of a best in show with a fantastic bird. They again always tell me it's from related pairs but when I dig into them they actually bred it from an outcross paired into one of their own birds.

My theory is that using the outcross with a pedigree-bred bird can bring out the best from the pair and produce a super youngster that's capable of the best in show. So many times these pairing we see this as the pairing that produces that top quality youngster. It's all about "hybrid vigour" and it seems to produce a big youngster and the amount of feather seems to explode.

For many years Doc Robinson was the top breeder in South Africa. He was known as an in-breeder and paired closely related birds. However, it was common knowledge that he used to frequently sell his best in show birds and never take them home from the show. When he had retired, sold all the birds and living in a flat, I sat with him one morning and we just talked budgies. I asked him about selling those best in show birds. He smiled and said most of them were bred out of an outcross cock and as an in-breeder, he did not want to take the best in show birds home - "they were just mongrels". That morning, suddenly so much fell into place for me.

There is yet another example of good birds not producing good youngsters. From time to time a novice will produce that wonder-bird, and it wins everything. We ask how it was bred and we never get a clear response and when that happens, I believe it's probably just a "sport" and came from nothing special in the bloodline. More often than not, we never hear of that novice again. The bird has no background and is never able to produce anything of note in the breeding cage.

For me breeding top quality birds is all about building a stud of good birds. They all start to look alike, and we have an excellent idea of what the pairs will produce. However, bring in that outcross that fits in with our own stock – and we have a chance of producing something special, but remember, it's going to be a mongrel!

Ring Issue: January Vs September

The on-going ring-issue debate! Let me confess, the first time that the date was changed from January to September, I was appalled - even angry. Why, because I did not think it through.

Now, unless you have lived your entire life in the concrete jungle, you will at some time have marvelled at the dead-looking deciduous tree in your yard, or on the street corner, as, all of a sudden, little green buds start to appear. Days get longer, nights shorter, bulbs begin to send shoots up through the ground, cold snaps decrease, wild birds begin their courtship rituals.

This, my friends, is Spring, the first season of the new year as determined by Nature. Not the calendar year in January, as decreed by the Romans. Our budgerigars do not carry a calendar around with them. Like all living things, naturally they respond to the call of Nature.

If you are a wealthy fancier, perhaps you can create an artificial environment to coincide with your annual holiday, or some other convenient event. Fortunately, these people are in the minority, as this is not in the best interests of the birds or the hobby. With our summers getting progressively hotter, we hear of fanciers losing breeding pairs because they

were tempted to breed in January and February, as temperatures soared as high as the mid-forties, when in August - September the weather is much milder.

Some of my friends worry about a 2016 bird having been bred 3 months earlier in 2015. This is simply a matter of mind-set. When you, as I do, mentally regard Spring as the start of the year, it should be possible to accept that a bird was hatched 4 months before the Romans decided to play God. This is fact: regardless of the date of issue, all around the world, Spring heralds the new year.

Remember with the distribution of 160,000 rings each year in Australia, you still stand a very good chance of purchasing a calendar-year rung bird, if you still think it is important!

There is a Facebook poll on January V September ring issue date on the Exhibition Budgerigar Soapbox page that was recently posted. Too early to give results yet. Why don't you check it out!

Ask the Judges

Question: Why is it that Clearwings are so harshly judged by judges looking for really clear winged birds? They tend to favour lesser birds with clear wings, over good quality Clearwing budgerigars with reasonably clear wings. Yet when they judge Spangles, they put up birds with poor spangle markings, or Normals that do not have black finite markings. It seems to be a cop-out that they do not penalise these other varieties as much as they do to Clearwings.

Answer: Craig Buckingham speaking as a senior panel judge, representing the judge panel and

committee says: **CLEARWINGS:** now as the name suggests, birds in this class should have wings clear of any markings, body colour of good contrast, and the overall budgerigar should meet the standard of perfection as close as possible.

However when judging classes of clearwings at most shows we tend to see predominately two variations on this ideal:

- Beautifully clean wings free of markings, body colour of good contrast and a poorer quality of bird; and
- Moderately clean to dirty winged birds, body colour of good to average contrast and generally a better quality of bird.

Now based on the current standard and the assessment of points, most often, bird number 2 tends to come first in the class. Therefore, I would tend to disagree with your observation that judges tend to favour lesser birds with clearer wings, however judges are often trying to find very clean wing birds that are of a good quality budgerigar.

Maybe the assignment of points should be altered in the standard for this variety to reward and encourage the breeding of beautifully clean winged birds with good contrast in body colour and less emphasis on the quality of bird as this variety will probably never meet or come close to the current standard of perfection. It would be good if this happened before we lose the clearwing completely from our show bench.

In regard to the spangles and normals being placed or preferred on the show bench with faults such as poorly marked spangle wings or smudged markings in the wings of normals,



you only seem to be looking at these points in isolation and not as a judges. The judge first looks

at the overall bird in comparison to the competition in that particular class on the day. Again as judges we have a standard to guide us to choose the bird that should win the class, by assessing all aspects of the bird in relation to the points allocated for colour, markings and type. So yes, sometimes we see birds placed first that may have specific faults that you have mentioned, but relevant to their competition on the day they are generally correctly positioned and "do I think it's a cop out by judges" as you have expressed, NO, judges cannot afford to look at wing comparisons in isolation.

Jean Painter would like to emphasize that the point scores in our Standard dictates what the Judges have to consider when selecting the best birds in any

variety.

Unfortunately the 60-40 allocation means that often the best examples of the variety birds are placed down the line because they are inferior in head quality, size, type, etc. and regardless of whether we are talking about



Clearwings or Spangles or any other variety the BEST BUDGERIGAR will win, not the best example of the variety unless it is both. We all admire the Clearwings with that wonderful contrast between the body colour and the pure white or yellow wings and the spangles that have the bullseye spots and clearly defined markings and the recessive pieds with just the right amount of melanin in the wings and the clear head because they are the ideal variety birds but until we can persuade the ANBC to change the point score in the Standard in favour of variety markings the Judges have to judge to the Standard regardless of personal preferences.

Response from Andrew Bourne: It is pretty clear from the photographs that judges at the National Level and the NSW level are doing a great job of choosing the best bird overall given all the variations you see in the Clearwing class. It is also clear (to me at least) that Clearwings are improving overall year to year under the current judging.



A Reminder about Polyomavirus

Lots of bird breeders have been very stressed of late around the whole topic of polyomavirus and what to do about it. I thought that a few sensible tips to guard against over-reaction and keep your aviary polyoma-free might be helpful for all.

- Always check any birds you wish to buy prior to purchasing new birds! If the birds are missing their long tail feathers or any of their flight feathers do not purchase them as they could possibly have the virus called polyomavirus, sometimes known as French Moult.
- Always quarantine any new birds to your aviary from every source no matter how experienced the breeder or how clean their aviary looks, how much you trust the person or how keen you are to breed with the birds. Vets suggest a full 6 weeks of isolation so that you can be as sure as possible that you are not bringing in any "new" disease to your aviary.
- Always make sure that the birds in your set up are as "stress-free" as is possible -excellent diet, plenty of space for every bird to perch and play and feed and a clean water supply and living conditions, help to keep stress to a minimum.
- 4. If you have birds that you suspect have the virus, please understand that it is contagious. If you have birds other than budgies, these birds CAN contract it as well. So all birds that have feather problems (except if they are moulting, obviously!) need to housed so that they are isolated from all other species.
- 5. If your young birds do grow back their feathers as they mature, there are some who believe that it is possible to use them in your

breeding programme in a carefully controlled situation away from other breeding birds. However, if they do not grow back their feathers, then they should not be used for breeding as the stress of the whole breeding process can result in dead in shell chicks, early death in nestlings and live chicks with feather disorders and polyomavirus in the next generation. For those intent on eliminating this disease from their aviary it is important to never use affected chicks in the breeding room.

- 6. If feather issues show up in a nest, discontinue breeding with these birds immediately and avoid using them again.
- Prevent the probability of having the virus appear in your nests by trying to restrict your breeding to just two rounds and try not to breed in the height of the summer months.
- 8. This disease is widespread in New Zealand, but is also very widespread in every country where people breed birds. Some of the best breeders of exhibition budgies, for example do have trouble with this disease, here in New Zealand and in England, Europe and Australia.
- 9. The Budgerigar Society of New Zealand (Inc.) is starting a process of trying to work on learning more about this disease by trying to work together with other countries to learn more about how the disease works, how to reduce the incidence of it and how to, perhaps, treat this disease here and internationally.
- 10. You can make a difference in your little corner of the breeding world by refusing to buy diseased birds, not breeding birds that have feather problems, providing your birds with an excellent diet based on seed and vegetables and keeping your birds as stressfree as is humanly possible.
