A big shout out Penrith Valley Branch members for the way they are carrying out their activities right now. I have had comments on your meetings, Facebook page and support given to new members. As President of the Society you tend to hear about all the improvements people want to see so to hear some positive feedback is very welcome. Well done, keep it up and I look forward to joining you for your May meeting.

The preparation for the 2018 ANBC National to be held in NSW continues with two venues currently being looked at, one at Homebush Bay and one at Penrith. Both have the facilities required and we are currently determining which one is going to be better for the show and those that attend. We have had also had confirmation in writing from Destination NSW of their intention to provide sponsorship for the show which will be a huge boost for NSW.

I am informed that the preparation for this year's Nationals in Tasmania is progressing well and registrations are now open so anyone intending to go along please register and book your accommodation as there are other events on in Hobart at that time so accommodation is booking up fast. The website link for updates and registration for the 2016 ANBC Nationals is http://www.national2016.com.

After a bit of concern from breeders in relation to the size of the rings most people seem to be managing reasonably well provided you ring your birds a day or two earlier. This matter has been taken up with the ANBC and is being looked at for future ring orders. Please also be mindful that Steve Cummins, the Ring Registrar is not in control of what happens to your rings once they are in the post. As many of you know Australia Post has made changes to the way it delivers mail so things are taking longer. We have had orders go missing totally only to turn up after the follow up order was sent out and received. Please also be sure to update your details with Myles Henke the Membership registrar should you move address.

The review of the Objects, Rules and By-Laws continues with Andrew Bourne having put in an enormous amount of work on this project to date. I have reviewed the most recent updates and they are nearing the point where they can be presented to the members for comment.

The website continues to be improved with one of the latest updates being the roll out of the on-line member's management system. This now allows members details to be updated online by the management team and sees Status and points received from shows updated very quickly. We now have real time updates so that we can have the website updated within a week of a show being held provided the results are sent through swiftly after the conclusion of the show.

The introduction of the members management system mentioned above has also meant a very big clean-up of member's details and data integrity including the removal of duplication or data that it no longer relevant. In reviewing that it has also given me the opportunity to gauge the membership numbers which contrary to popular belief have grown over the last couple of years which is a very pleasing result and we look forward to having this continue in the future.



Andrew Bourne, Phone Interview

John Barden's 2015 National Logie winning Spangle Double Factor is top quality bird that was described by the National Judges as "Powerful bird in good condition, with super width across the shoulder." This bird is from a family of 30 to 40 direct relatives in John's current stock. The family goes right back to when John first became interested in showing his budgies.

John has been breeding budgies for about 30 years and like most people was mostly interested in pretty colours for the first few years. Things changed when he met and became friends with Joy Boorman in the early nineteen nineties and a few years later with Bob Smith.

John obtained some Pilkington and Lane birds from Joy and bred his first Grand Champion from them. He swapped birds with Bob Smith and introduced some Plunkett and Tassie birds and some Scoble birds into the mix over the years.

These are the origins of the family of this successful Spangle line.



Another of John's lines has also been successful at the National level and continues to win Major Awards at top quality shows such as Newcastle,

<u>Canberra</u>, <u>Hills</u> and <u>MidState</u>. At the <u>Canberra</u> <u>National in 2011</u>, John took out second place with a Grey Opaline and fourth place with its brother in the Normal Class.

That family also thrives in John's aviary and is based on John's original Pilkington/Lane bloodlines with outcrosses from Joe Darman and Alan and Chris Druery which also contain Pilkington and/or Lane imported bloodlines.

Both lines continue to be successful on the show bench with plenty of Major Awards.

By-Law - Changes to the Show Rules

Please note there were changes to Show Rules at the March Management Meeting to amend the definition of "Unbroken Cap", "Juvenile" & "Young Birds". This change was required due to the altered ring issue date. There are more details below in the News from the Show Manager in the following section. For those who would like to view the full document, there is a link to the BSNSW Website - BY-LAW No 2(a), BUDGERIGAR SOCIETY OF NEW SOUTH WALES (Inc).SHOW RULES.

News from the Show Manager

Changes to the Show Rules for UBC

Every Branch is now entitled to have Unbroken Cap (UBC) classes in one show per show season (Calendar Year).

If you have a Young Bird Show with UBC classes then you may not have UBC in your Annual Show.

If you only run one show per year then you may choose to have any or all age categories in the show – Any Age, Young, Juvenile and UBC.

The new rules are:

"UBC" is a nest feathered bird as per the Standard.

"Juvenile" is a bird rung with a ring issued for the current calendar year. It will become a "Young"

bird in the following calendar year. Example: In 2016, a bird rung with a 2016 Gold ring is a "Juvenile" until 31st

"Young" is a bird which is/was eligible

December 2016.

to compete at the ANBC Competition in the current calendar year. It remains a "Young" bird until the 31st December following the ANBC Competition at which it was eligible to compete. Example: In 2016, a bird rung with a 2015 Purple ring is a "Young" bird until 31st December 2016.

"Any Age" (previously OLD) is an adult feathered bird of any age. Restricted exhibitors may only show birds in the "Open Any Age" section if there are no "Restricted Any Age" classes provided in the show schedule.

Note: "Juvenile" birds may be shown in "Young" bird classes where no "Juvenile" classes are provided in the show schedule (see ENTRIES Clause 9-2). If a bird is carrying two closed rings, the oldest ring will determine the eligibility status of the bird (see ENTRIES Clause 9-5).

Best of Variety in Show Competition

The Show Committee is pleased to inform you all about the BSNSW Inc. Best of Variety in Show Competition. It is on again in 2016 in a slightly changed format.

This competition is designed to increase participation in shows by BSNSW members and is open to BSNSW members only.

Branches and Associates may participate if their show is run in compliance with all BSNSW Rules and their schedule is approved by the BSNSW Show Manager.

The schedule should have "BSNSW Inc. Members Best of Variety in Show Competition" on the front cover.

The Best of Variety (BOV) in UBC, Young, Juvenile or Any Age in any authorised show will receive one point towards this competition if the club holding the show chooses to collect and provide the results.

The Novice, Intermediate and Open BOV in each Variety and Age Group will need to run off to decide winner of the Age Group BOV.

The points allocated are not status points for exhibitor status. Clubs will not be required to offer Rosettes, Ribbons or any other awards to these age group BOV winners. All you will need to do is record the winners in each age group and forward them to the Show Manager.

Please note: this is an "opt in" competition. If a Branch or club does not wish to participate they need not do so. You can elect to run Juvenile off with the Young birds and only give one set of points for Young birds. You also could just run them all off and only give one set of points the same as the status points. The competition is optional. It is all about attracting/encouraging people to show their birds.

The overall Best of Variety in Show will still be needed for the status points of your restricted members along with the other major awards.

We would like to apologise for the fact that we did not get this information out there sooner. We did the best we could and hope that everyone will take it in a spirit of fellowship going forward and make the best of the competition.

A quick note to the exhibitors: This competition does require extra work by your show secretarial people and your stewards. Please show your gratitude to those who choose to do that work on your behalf by supporting the competition with your entries.




BSNSW Working Group Report March 2016

- The Group was formed in September 2014 after a questionnaire was sent out to all BSNSW Members & Associates which was followed by a Forum to collate the information and start to implement ideas put forward. The Group was asked to collate information on how the BSNSW and its Associates can work more closely together.
- 2. The feedback to date is almost unanimous that both the BSNSW and the Associates are sick of the US & THEM mentality that has evolved and that we need to be and feel "Combined" if the hobby is to grow in NSW.




- 3. The Key factors that have emerged in moving forward are:
 - a) Maintaining independency and retention of funds by Clubs and Branches;
 - b) Flexibility with individual Show format;
 - c) All Clubs having equal say in the running of the "Combined" group;
 - d) Open communication this has been improved already; and
 - e) Retention of current assets by Clubs and Branches.
- 4. To date the Group has sought feedback from BSNSW Management, Hills Branch, West Sydney Branch, Central Coast Branch, during the 2015 STCC, Newcastle Club & Hunter Branch, St George Branch, The Pied Society and conservatively we have 90% in favour of change and prepared to be involved in making it happen.

- 5. Moving forward we have been asked to visit South Western NSW Budgerigar Society and Penrith Valley Branch.
- 6. Should the support continue as expected we would propose that a Forum be held in 2016 to bed down the ideas and set some milestones and timeframes of when and how we implement the feedback.

International Exhibition Budgerigar 20 -20 Interview with Bob Wilson

I don't know Bob personally but have had correspondence with him for a few years through the Internet and of course Facebook. Bob's always come across as a very knowledgeable and caring person always willing to go the extra mile for beginners. He is a credit to the hobby, not only with advice he shares but for the amount of work he does for the hobby. He attends the World Budgerigar Organisation (WBO) meetings and also judges. One of his latest adventures has been in Egypt which could only be described as one of the best thing anyone could ever be lucky enough to do as I'd jump at the chance. I will be in contact with Bob to thank him personally for taking the time for this wonderful insight into one of the biggest and most respected men in our hobby of Exhibition Budgerigars.



Congratulations on the fantastic job that you are doing and continue to do.

So let's take a look into what makes Bob Wilson tick

What started your interest in budgerigars?

I grew up in a family of bird breeders in Northern Victoria. My grandmother had budgies and Canaries and four uncles showed budgies. My father, who knew nothing about budgies, bought a pair for me as a Christmas present in 1959 when he was off on a business trip. The Sky Blue cock and Cinnamon Mauve hen bred some super Cobalts that won most times I showed them. I was hooked. Only years later did I learn that these birds had come from Frank Gardiner.

How long have you been in the hobby?

On and off since 1959. I sold my birds when I went off to University, started again... then moved to New Zealand and later to USA. A few breaks along the way for personal and business reasons. The bug hit me again in 2010, so I started again.

What Club & level do you show at?

I show in Champion in USA. I am Judges Administrator for Budgerigar Association of America, a lifetime member of America Budgerigar Society (ABS), and also joined The Budgerigar Society (UK). My local club is Greater Kansas City Aviculture Society.

What varieties do you keep?

My stud is mostly normals and cinnamons with a few spangles. I also have a few lutinos, recessive pieds and crests.

What is your best memory in the hobby?

My best memory in the hobby was placing second best in show at the 1991 All American in Indianapolis with a young Grey Green cock against 1056 entries.

Another experience, I will never forget was judging the first National Budgie Show in Cairo Egypt in April last year.

Name your three top budgerigar breeders in Australia or anywhere else USA or world.

I only visited a few breeders when I visited Australia for the Geelong Nationals in 2012 but I was very impressed with what I saw at Peter Thurn's and also Steve & Tim Grech.

Hard to limit UK/European breeders to three...Daniel Lutolf, Maarten Heylen, Willie Doktor, Huxley & Marchant, Bowkers, Mike Ball and Harry Hockaday must all get a mention.

Which bird room would you like to spend a day in having a one to one budgie chat?

Visits I plan for later this year are with my buddy Daniel Lutolf in Switzerland and also with Maarten Heylen in Belgium.

Society President, Harry Charalambous, Secretary Mark Wilton and Craig Buckingham spoke on "The Future of the Hobby". This discussion was most interesting with our members asking many questions. Our Committee discussed this topic at our December Committee Meeting.

Following is a summary written by one of our members on the night's presentation:

The November meeting featured a presentation by the Society's working group on proposals for restructuring the Society in a way that would see Branches replaced with separate entities akin to the current concept of associates, but with as yet undefined ties to a new central group. St George members present strongly agreed that there is a need to change current management arrangements but voiced concerns that the emerging proposal needs to be more comprehensive and not over-simplified with attention to structure separated from other areas of concern.

Specific issues suggested for attention included:

- Risk that incorporated 'branches' would necessarily be autonomous and not tied to 'super shows' or other practices if their members felt these were not in their best interests.
- Financial viability needs to be demonstrated with a 7 year budget.
- A less cumbersome management structure with specialist positions allowed and expected to manage their assignments outside management meetings with reporting to the membership at large, a small team to administer payments and correspondence

subject to reporting and audit and referral of significant matters for electronic voting rather than discussion in a Sydney based forum.

 A need to resolve whether the Society is to support all aspects of budgerigar keeping or focus on the exhibition aspect leaving other aspects to aviculture societies. The standard, competitive practices and the 'agenda' all suggest the Society has already defaulted to the 'exhibition' path with getting members' approval for this. A related issue is the position of Society members who do not participate in Branches or Associates.

DECEMBER MEETING: This was our Christmas Party and approximately 30 members and children enjoyed a happy festive night. Christmas items were donated by members to make a monster hamper which was raffled and won by Terese Ryan, with numerous other prizes being won by a number of other lucky winners. Become involved with your Branch

My involvement with Budgerigars started in 1974 when due to my husband Ted's work we moved to Sale in Victoria. Our children decided that they would like a budgie as a pet. A friend with whom Ted worked bred Budgerigars and when approached agreed to provide the pet budgie. This breeder asked that we come along and join the Sale and District Cage Bird Club, but at this time all we wanted was a pet budgie for the children – we weren't interested in breeding or going to bird clubs. Famous last words!

Sometime later the children decided the budgie was lonely and needed a companion, so back again to the breeder and again he asked us to come along to the Club. After some consideration we decided to go along; we liked what we saw and we were hooked. Not being people that can stand back and let other people do the work we became involved with Ted becoming secretary.

Another work related move saw us pack up our furniture, children, dog, cat and the two pet budgies and move to Wollongong to start a new phase of our life in the Illawarra. By this time the number of our birds had grown to something like 100 and so Ted arranged with a pilot of a light aircraft to fly to Sale, pick up our birds and bring them to Wollongong.

One of the first aviaries we visited in about 1975 had these beautiful budgies, striking green and blue in colour with lovely yellow and white wings without any markings whatsoever. We decided that these were for us and hence our line of Clearwings began.

This was the start of our award winning Clearwings that we are so successful with today at all levels of competition. Other varieties that we breed are Normals, Cinnamonwings, Dominant Pieds, and Opalines.

Marilyn Harrington

When we arrived in Wollongong we joined the Illawarra Branch of the then Budgerigar Society of Australia, now the Budgerigar Society of New South Wales (BSNSW).

We needed to obtain some NSW birds so we approached the late Edgar Barham who was the Branch Chairperson. He suggested we contact his niece and her husband up in South Coogee and hence a long friendship began with Nola and Bruce Bradford. They let us have a number of birds with which we did reasonably well.

Others that I would like to acknowledge for the help they have given us over the years are: Colin Morgan with his Clearwings; Sandy Stacey with his Clearwings; Bruce Wilson of the Wilson and Hoadley partnership (Victoria) for his Clearwing outcrosses; and Peter Dodd for his donation of a superb Normal Grey cock which has been

the backbone of our winning birds over the last few years. I would be remiss if I didn't also acknowledge Warren Wilson who has done so much for the Clearwing variety and, in particular, his more than generous donation of his prize winning Clearwing from the National Championships at Coffs Harbour.

I don't think my attitude to breeding has changed much over the years. I have

always believed that one should take good care of their birds. Plenty of foods, fresh water, flying space, and veterinarian care when needed to ensure the birds are fit and healthy to raise youngsters.

We feed our birds a seed mix that we have specially

mixed for us from Elenbee Bird Seeds. This mix consists of 40 per cent plain canary, 10 per cent pannicum, 10 per cent white millet and 40 per cent Jap millet. We mix our own tonic mix, which we feed along with greens, corn, whole oats and sunflower seeds.

Then of course we have cuttlebone, iodine blocks and shell grit readily available.

Water is changed every second day in the cooler months and every day in warm weather.



Our aviary design hasn't changed much over the years, but we believe birds should have as much length in the flights as possible so that they can get plenty of exercise. Currently our aviary consists of two flights about five metres long with some two metres of the outside flights open to the weather. There is also a small inside flight in which the youngsters are housed after being taken out of the nappy cage. The breeding room has 20 cabinets with seed storage areas underneath the banks of cages. Because of lack of space our nest boxes are made to slide into the cabinets.

We are no different to anyone else when we pair our birds. We look for size, head quality, shoulders, deportment and the fertility of the birds. With our Clearwings, trying to maintain size along with the clarity

of wings is the hardest. We find that the larger the bird the more likely they are to have wing markings. Over the years, we have tried outcrosses to many varieties but with little or no success. Maybe we haven't kept at it long enough to achieve the desired outcome. We have found that our best results have come from pairing Clearwing to Clearwing. We are always on the look out to find good Clearwings to use as outcrosses and this

year we have been able to source a number that we hope will give us a boost in our youngsters.

When selecting our breeding pairs Ted and I seem to have different ideas about what should be paired to what. Over the years we have had some lively discussions because we don't always agree on the proposed pairing. I look after our records in the birdroom and over the years have kept to the same system that allows us to go back right to the first bird we bred.

I find it hard to separate the 'I' from the 'we' as Ted and I work as a team. We bounce things off each other and share the workload. Whilst Ted was working I had the task of the aviary management having to do most of the caring and cleaning in the aviary and birdroom. Now that Ted has 'retired' we do the aviary tasks together. Ted will work in the flights whilst I start on the breeding cabinets and then Ted comes and helps me complete the cabinets. The final task is to inspect the nest boxes hoping that we find no disasters and only good news. We ring chicks, clean nest boxes and make sure both the cock and hen are okay.

As to changes we have seen over the years, with the import of the English Budgerigars it has become apparent that on the show bench size, head qualities and shoulder now have preference over good deportment, condition and colour of the birds.

The declining membership has become a real concern, with Branches struggling to retain their identity. We can see this happening at the moment with the amalgamation of two Branches. I believe that this declining membership has many reasons including the reduced size of house building blocks. The increase in home ownership prices has meant both partners have to work to meet their financial commitments giving them less spare time.



Barbara checks a chick from the 2007 breeding season The advent of auctions has seen a dramatic increase in the price of birds of a reasonable quality. This means people new to the Fancy (or on a limited income) are not able to acquire birds at a reasonable price.

When I started in the Fancy all the clerical work was done manually but today most shows are run with the use of computer programs.

This has been brought about by the hard work of people like Ken Yorke and Maureen Bourne.

I believe one of the biggest changes in the Fancy has been the way that the State Team Challenge Competition is run and how the State team is selected for the National Championships. I feel that this has been an excellent improvement in this competition and the results in the last few years at the National Championships have proven this in no uncertain terms.

Another big change is that exhibitors including ourselves don't take as many birds to a show. In previous years it was not uncommon to enter 20 or 30 birds, but today this is now the exception with most exhibitors only taking along on average about 8 or 10 birds. I believe that if you go to the trouble of breeding quality Budgerigars then exhibiting follows as a matter of course. Also when you exhibit your birds you can compare them against other birds exhibited. From this you can judge how your birds are improving and what areas you need to address to ensure that your birds are continuing to be competitive.

Since starting in the Fancy I have had many tasks at Branch level. I have held the positions of publicity officer, show secretary, Services Section manager, delegate to BSNSW Management meetings and provider of suppers.

At the Society level I have held the position of Services Section manager, editor of Budgerigar for 15 years and

currently I hold the position of Ring Registrar. I am also a member of the Show Committee and have for many years arranged the trophies and prizes for the BSNSW's Annual Show. I am also on the Committee of the Clearwing Society which under the chairmanship of Warren Wilson has done so much for our favourite variety.

The highlight of our time in the Fancy was in 1982 winning the Normal Green Class at the National Championships in Townsville. We were on a high for days. This bird went on to win three Grand Champions in the following year at annual shows.

Our other high point was being made Life Members


of BSNSW in 1996. This was the pinnacle of our work for the Fancy.

Major awards have come along intermittently with a Grand Champion at the National Cage Bird Show in 1998 and at the Sydney Royal Easter Show in 2007.

One win we look forward to and, who knows we might finally achieve it, is the Clearwing Logie at the National Championships. We have had many Clearwings selected to represent the state but until now have only been able to be the bridesmaid on two occasions – in 2004 at Coffs Harbour and 2006 at Caloundra.

More women today are breeding and exhibiting Budgerigars than you would have seen in previous times. They are becoming judges and stewards, doing all the other jobs at shows and taking on administrative roles. However we are yet to see a woman President of the Society, but there have been a number of women as chairpersons within the Branches.

There are also women who are not interested in the birds themselves, but support their partners in their chosen hobby. Over the years I have been in the Fancy there have been some humorous moments, like the time we benched a Clearwing and the judge was trying to get the bird onto the perch. The bird was jumping the right height but not landing on the perch. After some little while the judge finally realised that the cage had no perches. No one picked it up — not the owners, stewards or for some time

the judge! That judge keeps reminding us about this and tells us to check our perches.

To newcomers to the Fancy, don't give up easily. Things can and do go wrong. Talk to anyone in the Fancy and they will tell you the same thing. No one is *immune to birdroom* disasters. You can go to shows and not even come home with a place card don't get discouraged. Breeding quality exhibition Budgerigars takes time, just hang in there. Success will

come with time and experience. Learn about the birds themselves. Don't hesitate to approach experienced breeders to talk about your birds as they are always willing to give advice.


